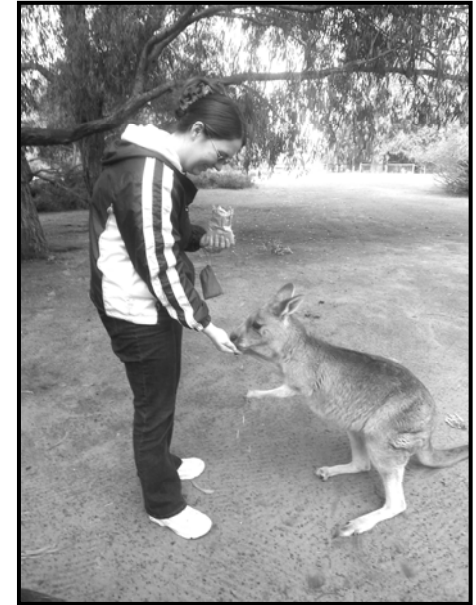

Benefits of the Exchange

- The opportunity to develop long-lasting friendships, become better informed on global issues and better know and understand yourself.
- Increase self-esteem and confidence by learning to adapt to new situations and ways of communication.
- Instill positive cross-cultural attitudes and skills that enhance neutral understanding and acceptance of all people.
- A method of learning another culture and lifestyle from the insider's viewpoint while experiencing daily life.



Expectations

- Attend a pre-departure orientation at Upham Woods in Wisconsin Dells during the first weekend of March and a re-entry workshop in early September.
- Participate fully and wholeheartedly in the total planned experience.
- Read all the materials that are sent to you from the International 4-H Programs office and abide by the specific deadlines. Complete all cultural assignments.
- Act as a responsible representative for Wisconsin, U.S.A., and the 4-H program while abroad.
- Learn about the country you will be visiting, the family you will be staying with and their way of life.
- Share what you have in common with your host family as well as those things that are unique in your lives.
- Be respectful of the differences you may find in your host family, community and country and learn to appreciate those differences you identify.
- Be flexible, patient, and able to communicate, both verbally and non-verbally with your host family. Some of the participants will have limited English communication skills, at least initially.

Adult Advisors

Adult Advisors travel with the delegation and stay with a host family within reach of the delegates during the stay. Each advisor must be 25 years old and have Wisconsin 4-H Youth Protection certification. They must also have relevant experience working with youth and international travel. Adult Advisors must be approved by the State International Coordinator.
