

### There is more than ONE right way...



Ask for volunteers. Pass a bath towel to each volunteer and ask them to fold it the way they would fold it at home. When all towels are folded go from person to person and ask them to show the group how they folded their towel. Observe that, indeed, each towel got folded as requested – but differently.

Ask the audience to “vote” by show of hands of clapping, etc. which one is “right”.

Ask each person why they folded it the way they did. Likely responses will include:

- This is the way my mother taught me
- This is how I have to fold it for it to fit into the towel cabinet
- I like the way it looks

Consider how this works in the area of the family’s money and decisions about money.

- Who decides what the “right” way is?
- How do you make decisions about money and why?
- How can you share your different ideas about the right way and make decisions that avoid conflict?

The important take-away message is that there is often more than one way and rarely ever ONLY one right way to do things.
