



WISCONSIN STATE 4-H ADULT LEADER COUNCIL CONSTITUTION

Adopted March 29, 1993

Revised and adopted 1994, 1998, 2002

Article I – Name

The name of the group shall be Wisconsin State 4-H Adult Leader Council

Article II – Purpose

The purpose of the council is to enhance UW-Extension 4-H Youth Development programs at the state, county and local level.

Article III – Membership

Section 1. Council membership is comprised of one voting adult 4-H leader from each of the Wisconsin counties/nations.

Section 2. Membership on the Council shall not be limited by race, creed, physical ability, sexual orientation, gender, socio-economic level, or ethnic origin.

Article IV – Executive Board

Section 1. The Executive Board is comprised of three people from each district plus one alternate/district who serves in the absence of the regular board member.

Section 2. There will be an election of one new person/district/year from a district caucus held at the annual Fall meeting. Each district also elects an alternate each year to a one-year term.

Section 3. The officers of the Executive Board are elected by the membership at the annual Fall meeting.

Article V – Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Council shall be President, President Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and any others as needed.

Section 2. Officers shall serve a one-year term except treasurer which is a two-year term.

Section 3. Officers shall not succeed themselves in the same office.

Section 4. If a vacancy should occur, the Executive Board will elect a replacement at the next meeting for the unexpired term.

Article VI – Elections

Section 1. Elections will be annually at the Fall meeting.

Article VII – Amendments to the Constitution

The Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the total membership at any regular meeting provided notice of such amendment shall have been distributed to the membership by mail postmarked 10 business days prior to the meeting.

Article VIII – Dissolution

In case of dissolution of the Council, all assets are to be assigned to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation.
