

2010 Wisconsin 4-H International Programs Summer Host Family Description

Can't find the time and money to travel? Enjoy the exposure to different cultures which traveling brings? Looking for a low-cost project or experience in which the whole family can participate and grow together? 4-H allows families to gain the benefits of international travel right here at home by hosting an exchangee from Japan, Korea, Mexico or one of many other countries. Families often find they are drawn closer together and see their lives in a whole new perspective as they welcome a new son, daughter, brother or sister into their family circle.

4-H/Japan-Korea Summer Exchanges

Japanese and South Korean youth aged 12-18 visit from mid-July to mid-August. They are members of Japanese organizations devoted to the study of foreign cultures and languages. Youth are placed in homes where there is a host sibling of approximately the same age and gender.

4-H/Finland and 4-H Norway Exchanges

Finnish and Norwegian 4-H youth aged 15-18 stay with a family for 4 weeks during the summer. Youth are placed in homes with host siblings of approximately the same age and gender. Note that Norwegian 4-H'ers visit the U.S. on odd-numbered years only.

4-H/Mexico and Costa Rica Exchange

Mexican and Costa Rican youth aged 14-18 stay with a family for 4 weeks during the summer. Like the Koreans' program, LEX Mexico and 4S Costa Rica focuses on teaching multiple languages simultaneously! Youth are placed in homes with host siblings of approximately the same age and gender. At least one member of the family should have an understanding of Spanish.

Adult Chaperones

Adult chaperones will accompany the month-long delegations. Adults will stay two weeks with two different host families during the exchanges. (Mexico exchange chaperone will stay at one home during the 3 week stay.)

4-H is seeking all types of families to give exchangees as broad a perspective as possible about life in the U.S. Urban families, rural families, single-parent families, older couples, singles, couples without children and families with varied religious and ethnic backgrounds all have something to offer visitors from other cultures.

Other than having a genuine interest in other cultures, the main requirement is that all members of the host family over the age of 18 complete the Wisconsin 4-H Youth Protection Program screening. Being a 4-H International host family is easy, fun, rewarding, and educational. Welcome the exchangee into your home and treat him or her like one of the family.

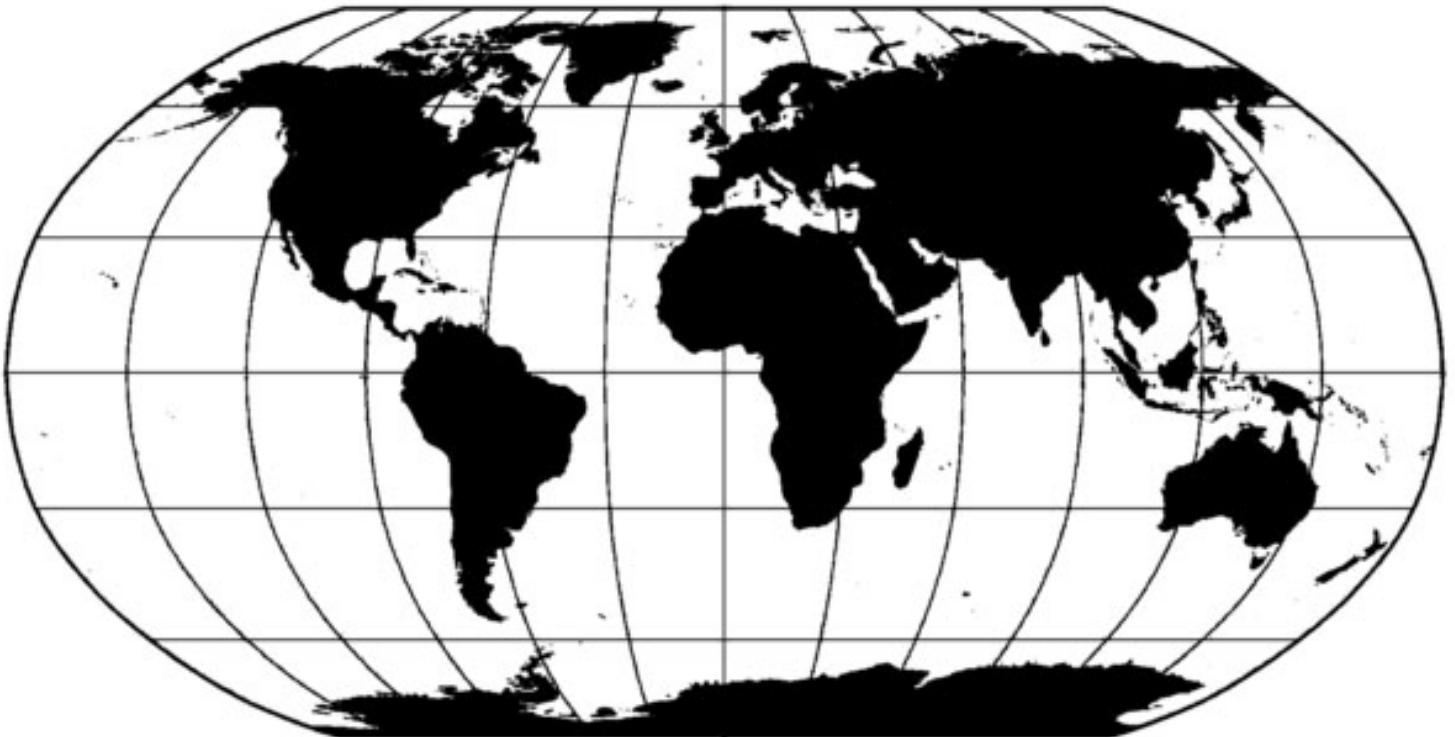
The exchangees will want to join in everyday activities, help with chores and otherwise fit in as a brother, sister, son or daughter. No special activities need to be planned, although most families and visitors enjoy the opportunity to take occasional sightseeing trips to local attractions and landmarks during the visit.

Host families appreciate the chance to develop friendships which reach around the world. They find that the exchangee teaches them not only to understand other ways of life, but to understand and appreciate their own way of life as well.

EXPECTATIONS OF HOST FAMILIES:

- Read all 4-H International materials sent by the county or state office. Comply with the deadlines as noted.
- Participate in teleconference orientation in the spring and face-to-face orientation at the pick-up point.
- Families are encouraged to correspond with exchangees and get to know them before they arrive.
- Exchanging photographs of family members, pets, and your home are a good way to become acquainted.
- Make arrangements to pick up the exchangee at arrival and drop him/her off at departure.
- Provide the exchangee with meals and lodging.
- Include the exchangee in all family activities.
- Families are encouraged to learn about their exchangee's country, culture, foods, family and lifestyle.
- Families must attend a mid-point meeting half-way through the exchange. These are set-up in different regions throughout the state to minimize travel time and distance.
- Contact your local volunteer County Coordinator or the State 4-H International Program office immediately if illness, problems or other major concerns are evident.
- Be flexible, patient and able to communicate, both verbally and non-verbally with your exchangee. Many of the participants will have limited English communication skills.
- Although the exchangee does not necessarily need a private room, the program requires that he/she is provided with his/her own bed.
- The teen matched to host the international guest must keep this exchange uppermost in mind during the hosting period and make sure the exchangee feels comfortable around friends and is included in activities.
- Have fun!

The host family experience doesn't end when the exchangee returns home. Often the friendships formed last a lifetime! Host families find that exchangees really do become members of the family and sometimes are able to visit the family again on a subsequent trip. 4-H families also make efforts to visit their exchangee in their home country either through the 4-H Exchange or through private travel. For host families, the world suddenly becomes smaller!

How to apply to be a 4-H International Host Family:

Complete and submit this page and the attached application forms (with required signatures) to the WI 4-H International Programs address listed below. Please forward recommendation forms to the appropriate designees including your county 4-H Youth Agent.

Following receipt of your application, an interview may be scheduled. Early applications will receive preference for age and gender requests. However, applications will continue to be accepted until all exchangees are placed. Returning the application does not obligate your family in any way, nor does it assure assignment of an exchangee.

Families receive notification of selections and additional hosting information about mid-May. Selection is based on the application, references and how well the exchangee matches your family's preferences and interests. Placements are completed as soon as biographical information about exchanges is received from the cooperating organizations. We try to give families as much time as possible so they can write letters and become acquainted with their exchanges prior to arrival.

WI 4-H INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS SUMMER HOST APPLICANT CHECKLIST

- Host Participant Application Original application must be completed and signed by all appropriate parties as indicated on the application. The application is not complete unless a family picture (or picture of the exchange host) is included with the application. **Mail to WI State 4-H Office, International Programs by February 1, 2010.**
- Picture A picture or pictures of the exchange host and family must accompany the application. Digital photos may be emailed to the state 4-H office at: **kay.hobler @ces.uwex.edu.**
- Confidential Host Family References The host family gives copies of this form to 2 individuals to complete and mail back to the state 4-H office. Forms should be confidential. **Do not have a relative complete this form.**
- Agent Confidential Recommendation The host family must contact their current 4-H Youth Development Agent and have them complete this confidential recommendation form. If you have not been in the 4-H program or are not currently active in the 4-H program please contact a school teacher or principal, youth organizational leader (i.e. scout leader), or someone who is an authority figure who knows the family well.
- Host Family "In-Home" Interview Report The host family must contact a County Coordinator or the WI 4-H International Programs office to conduct an interview with interested families following guidelines on interview form. The interview report will be kept for state office records.
- Code of Conduct Hosts and their parent/guardian should read completely. Hosts will not be allowed to participate without a signed form, indicating they agree to adhere to all program rules & expectations.
- Volunteer Record Application Form All persons 18 and over living in the home during the exchange period need to have a background check done. All persons must complete the background check disclosure form (if not a certified 4-H volunteer) and include this with your application. All current 4-H volunteers must have completed the 4-H Youth Protection Program in the county where they are current certified volunteers.
- Volunteer Behavior Expectation Form All persons 18 and over must read and sign the WI 4-H Volunteer Behavior Expectations form to serve as a host family.
