

Archery Tournament Rules
Recurve, Compound, and Longbow
Tri-County 4-H Archery
Statewide Indoor Invitational Shoot 2005

1. To be eligible to take part in this tournament you must be registered as a WI 4-H Shooting Sports archery project member as recognized in your county. A certified 4-H Archery Leader acknowledgement is required on registration form.
2. Archers must be registered and on the shooting line prior to 2:00 p.m.
3. **Archers must shoot at their assigned times.**
4. Archers are limited to two archery classes (not including one longbow class) that must be in the same age division. All archery classes must be shot on the same day. If entering in two/three archery classes, one/two classes must be completed before noon on Saturday. Classes are defined on the registration form.
5. ***Your age will be determined by your age on the first day of the tournament.***
6. Junior competitors (age 8yr + 3rd grade - 11yr.) will shoot at 10 yards (5-10 yards-longbow) - 60 arrows. Intermediate competitors (age 12 yr - 14 yr) will shoot at 15 yards (5-15 yards-longbow) - 60 arrows. Senior competitors (age 15yr - 1yr/f/hs (following high school) will shoot at 20 yards (10-20 yards-longbow) - 60 arrows. Two practice ends are allowed prior to the first scoring end. (10 arrows total.)
7. Archers can register in the next older age division on the original registration form only. Your entry age division must be the same throughout the tournament (wildlife ecology/air rifle/archery/wildlife art/team competition).
8. Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.
9. All bows (except foot bows and crossbows) are permitted. There are separate classes for recurve, compound, and longbow (See additional long bow rules.). **Bare bow** (no aids except string nock and arrow rest) is any recurve or compound bow without aids. A participant's face marking for an anchor point, etc. is not permitted. **Bow with aid(s)** permits use of a sight pin, peep sight, release and/or a stabilizer, etc. A participant's face marking for an anchor point, etc. is considered an aid.
10. Each article listed is considered as one aid: **bow sight with or without sight bracket, stick on sight, mark on bow, release, peep sight, kisser-button, clicker, level, stabilizer, wrist or finger sling, participant face mark, etc.** Magnified sights are automatically entered in the class with four or more shooting aids. Laser sights are not permitted. Arm guards (recommended but not required), gloves/tabs, and quivers are considered safety equipment and are not counted as an aid. For safety reasons, shoulder/back quivers are not allowed. Bow draw weights may not exceed 60 pounds for safety purposes. **Heavy draw weight bows are subject to testing before/after shooting.**
12. **Equipment determined to be unsafe by the range commander/tournament committee cannot be used in the tournament. Corrective action may be taken provided it does not affect the participant's scheduled shooting time.**
13. Archers are responsible loss or damage of their equipment and for property damage/harm to themselves and as inflicted upon others.
14. **Archers using a release must pass a verbal and/or proficiency test ON-SITE before tournament shooting.**
15. Designated scoring personnel will do all scoring. Any arrow or target touched before scoring will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero. Bounce outs or pass through will be scored only if the designated scorer can unquestionably determine the point of impact; otherwise, these will be re-shot at the end of the round.
16. **Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must touch the scoring ring to score the higher value.** The range commander will immediately determine any questionable call. This decision is final.
17. Archers are given the option to re-add their scores when finished shooting and will be done between the shooting and waiting lines. Parents and coaches are not allowed to review the scorecard. Scorecards are signed by the archer and scorekeeper. Scorecards are property of the tournament and will not be returned. Archers are encouraged to write their score on the target face, which they can keep. No scoring challenge may be made from a participant's target face.
18. Shooting time limit is 4 minutes per end (5 arrows). You will receive one time limit warning.

19. Equipment failure needs to be reported to a tournament official as soon as possible. The shooter will have up to 15 minutes off the line to make any repairs and have two practice ends (10 arrows) prior to returning to tournament scoring. Assistance for repairs is permitted. Only one equipment timeout during each class.
20. F.I.T.A./N.A.A. Whistle commands will be used. See the posted safety rules.
21. N.F.A.A. single spot or 5 spot target will be used. When on the range, shooters must choose single or 5 spot target face (more than one arrow may hit any of the spots). A shot-out target face may be replaced as needed.
22. No coaching, spotting, or communicating allowed on line or from behind the line during competition. Archers must adjust their equipment on the line without help. Safety issues will be handled by the range commander.
23. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested on the original registration form and approved by the archery range commander/tournament committee prior to the tournament.
24. N.F.A.A. / N.A.A. Guidelines will govern event tiebreakers and any other concerns not covered on Tri-County Tournament Rules as interpreted by range commander or tournament committee chair person.
25. Competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship at all times.
26. **Dress properly. No shooter mid-section may be exposed while shooting.**
27. Any rule infraction(s) may disqualify a participant at any time during the tournament as determined by the range commander or tournament committee chairperson.
28. **Longbow Target Class Rules:**
 - a) Any straight limb (minimal curve) bow without curved/recurve tips when the bow is strung or unstrung. When strung, the string may only touch the bow in the string notches.
 - b) Bow material is of wood, plastic, fiberglass, or laminations without metal support except as in part of a take down feature.
 - c) A mark on the string for the nocking point is acceptable, however no buildup on the center serving or string nock is permitted.
 - d) Plastic nocks are permitted on target point tip arrows (any composition) only.
 - e) No aids - sights, marks, kisser button, participant face marking, stabilizer, releases, etc. are permitted.
 - f) Arrow release should be performed with two fingers below and one finger above the arrow nock.
 - g) Olympic style targets, 3-D, and picture targets will be used.
 - h) Junior competitors (age 8yr + 3rd grade/11yr.) will shoot at approx. 5-10 yards (60 arrows). Intermediate competitors (age 12 yr-14 yr) will shoot at approx. 5-15 yards (60 arrows). Senior competitors age 15yr-1yr/f/hs will shoot at approx. 10-20 yards (60 arrows). Two practice ends are allowed prior to the first scoring end. (10 arrows total.) Competitors will determine shooting distances without range finders.
 - i) Bow draw weights may not exceed 60 pounds. **Heavy draw weight bows are subject to testing before/after shooting.**
 - j) Arm guards (recommended but not required), gloves/tabs, and quivers are considered safety equipment. For safety reasons, shoulder/back quivers are not allowed.
 - k) All rule interpretations/modifications will be addressed by the range commander/tournament committee and their decision is final.
 - l) **Additional rules for the “Longbow without arrow shelf” class.**
 - 1) No arrow shelf on the bow.
 - 2) Arrows must be shot off the hand (glove permitted) and no other arrow rest is permitted.
 - 3) A flat hand (heel) type bow grip with or without laminated build-up is permitted. Only an angular or curved or offset grip is permitted.
 - 4) Grip may be covered with material provided it does not build out the grip.
 - m) **Additional rules for the “Longbow with arrow shelf” class.**
 - 1) Any arrow shelf on the bow or on the grip is permitted.
 - 2) Arrows must be shot from the shelf and no other arrow rest is permitted.
 - 3) Arrow shelf may have material covering.
 4. The bow grip can be any type – angular, formed, curved, or offset.
 5. Grip may be covered with material and may build out the grip.

Washington County 4-H Archery Safety Rules

Archery is lots fun, but the fun can quickly turn into tragedy unless every archer observes some common sense rules. Before you even think about using your bow, learn these rules and make up your mind to follow them every time you hold a bow. Remember, most accidents are the result of carelessness and thoughtlessness.

As an archer, you must learn and practice these few simple rules:

1. **Follow the instructions of the range commander.** Give attention and listen to the range commander. Ask questions if you do not understand what is said.
2. **Always use proper safety equipment,** including an arm guard, finger tab or glove.
3. **Always use arrows of the proper length for you.** Arrows that are too short can cause injuries.
4. **Always inspect your equipment before shooting.** damaged equipment should be repaired or replaced to avoid injuries. Replace the bowstring whenever it becomes worn.
5. **Wear snug fitting clothes, tie back long hair, remove large earrings, and clear off any pins or remove anything from chest pockets.**
6. **Always aim and shoot only at definite target:** never shoot just for the sake of shooting. Always be sure you know what your target is and that it is safe to shoot at. If you are not sure, take a closer look, you are still not sure, do not shoot.
7. **Always be sure the area around and behind your target is clear before you shoot.**
Never shoot if there is a chance your arrow may ricochet from the target or another object and hit someone.
8. **POINT and DRAW your arrow only in the direction of your target.**
9. **Never “DRYFIRE” your bow.** Always have an arrow on the string when shooting the now.”
“DRYFIRING”, shooting a bow without an arrow, can seriously damage a bow
10. **Always walk, never run, on the archery range.** If you run, you might accidentally cross in front of another archer, step on arrows lying on the ground, or trip and fall into the target and be injured by arrows sticking out of it.
11. **Shoot only with the knowledge and approval of your parents.**
12. **Follow the whistle commands given by the range commander.** If you are not familiar with the whistle commands ask the range commander to give verbal commands with the whistle blasts until you are familiar with them.

WHISTLE: TWO BLASTS

VERBAL: “ Archers to the shooting line.”

Meaning: Pick up the bow and move into position on the shooting line. Do not pick up the arrows.

WHISTLE: ONE BLAST

VERBAL: “Begin Shooting”

Meaning: Archers may take the arrows out of the quivers and begin shooting.

WHISTLE: THREE BLASTS

VERBAL: “Walk forward and get your arrows,”

Meaning: Archers have completed shooting. All archers have set their bows down and are standing behind the waiting line. They may now go forward to the target line and pull their arrows.

WHISTLE: FOUR OR MORE BLASTS (series of blasts)

VERBAL: “STOP, STOP, STOP, STOP” or CEASE FIRE”

Meaning: Immediately let down and put arrows back in the quiver, and step back behind the waiting line. There is an emergency on the range.

Remember to follow those unspoken rules in archery that we call **Range Etiquette**. Ask your leader for a copy.

.177 PELLET AIR RIFLE (Plinker, Sporter, & Unlimited/Precision) 3 Position Tri-County 4-H Archery Statewide Indoor Invitational Shoot 2005

1. To be eligible to take part in this tournament you must be registered as a WI 4-H Shooting Sports air rifle project member as recognized in your county. A Certified 4-H Air Rifle Leader acknowledgement by signature is required on the registration form.
2. Competitors must be registered and on the shooting line prior to 12:30 PM.
3. **Shooters must shoot at their assigned times.**
4. Competitors are limited to two air rifle classes that must be in the same age division. If entering in two classes, one class must be completed by 11:00 AM. Both classes must be shot on the same day.
5. ***Your age will be determined by your age on the first day of the tournament.***
6. Junior competitors are age 8yr + 3rd grade - 11yr. Intermediate competitors are age 12 yr. - 14 yr. Senior competitors are age 15yr – 1 yr/f/hs (following high school). Air rifle competitors can register in the next older age division on the original registration form only. Your entry age division must be the same throughout the tournament (wildlife ecology, archery, air rifle, wildlife art and team competition).
7. Each shooter will fire from 3 positions. Prone, standing, and kneeling at 10 meters (33 feet) 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots. Shooter must be in the proper position while shooting.
8. Floor mats will be provided.
9. The time limit is 10 minutes per position. Unlimited sighting shots in a 5 minute period are allowed in the prone position only. You can view your target after sighting shots and between positions.
10. Targets are the standard NRA AR-5/10.
11. Shooters will provide their own ammunition; only target grade pellets are allowed. Ammunition must be .177 caliber pellets only. **No BB's are allowed.**
12. **Ten pellets must be counted before each scoring position is shot.**
13. Rifles must be loaded and **fired in a single fashion only.**
14. **Sights:** Only sights manufactured for the air rifle are permitted. No adjustable iris or aperture may be used in the front or rear sights. No magnified or telescopic sights allowed.
15. Slings are allowed for all Kneeling and Prone positions. Kneeling rolls are allowed for the kneeling position only. Slings are not allowed in the standing position.
16. An air rifle is any type .177 caliber (4.5mm) pneumatic, spring air, compressed air or CO2 rifle can be used. All air rifles must have a trigger pull weight of at least 1.5 pounds. Equipment will be tested, can be adjusted, and retested. Air rifles with a trigger pull of less than 1.5 pounds are not permitted for safety purposes.
17. Equipment determined to be unsafe or not meeting the trigger pull weight can not be used in the tournament. Corrective action may be taken provided it does not effect the participant's scheduled shooting time.
18. An air rifle that is not readily identifiable with factory markings must be accompanied with the owners manual showing the proper identification of the rifle. If proper identification is not provided, the air rifle will be placed in the unlimited/precision class.

25. No shooting jackets, shooting gloves, or other shooting aides attached to the rifle or shooter, except slings as noted above, are allowed.
26. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested on the original registration form and must be approved by the range officer.
27. Competitors must stand alone at the competition line. **YOU MUST CHARGE YOUR OWN AIR RIFLE.** No coaching, spotting, or communication allowed on line or from behind the line during competition. You must adjust your own equipment.
28. Ties will be broken with the most number of “tens”, then the best score in the standing position. Then the most number of

- “nines”, most number of “eights “, etc. The next tiebreaker will be the first “ten” hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
29. All shooters and any other persons on or in the immediate vicinity of the firing line must wear adequate eye protection with side shields. Safety glasses will be available.
 28. Competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship at all times.
 29. **Dress properly. No shooter mid-section may be exposed while shooting.**
 30. Any rule infraction(s) may disqualify a participant at any time during the tournament as determined by the range officer or tournament committee chairperson.
 31. National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules will govern any other concerns not covered on the Tri County Tournament Rules as interpreted by the range officer. **These rules may be viewed or downloaded at the CMP web site: www.civilianmarksmanshipprogram.com**

Washington County 4-H Air Rifle Safety Rules

1. Follow the instructions of the range officer.
2. Treat all guns as if they are loaded.
3. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction
4. Be sure of your target and what is beyond it.
5. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
6. Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.
7. Be sure the barrel and action are clear.
8. Use correct ammunition for your firearm.
9. Learn the mechanical and handling characteristics of the firearm you are using.
10. Never point a firearm at anything you do not wish to shoot.
11. Never climb a tree, fence, or jump a ditch with a loaded firearm.
12. Never shoot at a flat hard surface or water.
13. Shoot only with the knowledge and approval of your parents.
14. Do not pick up BB's or pellets from the floor when on the firing line.
15. Safety Glasses must be worn when shooting or near the firing line.
16. Follow commands given by the range officer:
 - "Bolt open --- safety on"**
 - "Charge"**
 - "Loader load"**
 - "Bolt forwards --- safety off"**
 - "Aim and fire"**
 - "Bolts open --- safety on"**
