PROCEDURES and SUMMARY RULES

General Rules

1. All shooters must be registered as a 4-H Shooting Sports (Naturespace) project member, or have completed a 4-H Shooting Sports class **and** DNR Hunter Safety course and have turned in a signed Permission Statement. All participants must also have met the criteria set by their county Shooting Sports committee
2. Safety is the primary consideration. Each contestant must provide, and wear, eye protection for all shooting events. Appropriate ear protection shall be worn for all shooting events other than air rifle and archery. Any violation of safe shooting is grounds for disqualification.
3. Range commanders shall check all firearms, ammunition, bows and arrows prior to its use in competition. Unsafe equipment will not be allowed on the range.
4. Contestants are responsible for providing their own equipment, including ammunition, arrows, ear plugs, safety glasses, and mats.
5. Three competition classes are recognized. Ages 8 (and in 3rd grade) – 11 are junior competitors; ages 12 - 14 are intermediate competitors; and ages 15 - 19 (must be 19 as of January 1st of 4-H year) are senior competitors. **ALL AGES ARE AS OF DATE OF INVITATIONAL, current year.**
6. All rifles, shotguns, and bows will be cased and unloaded until the competitor is instructed to uncase on the firing line.
7. The range commander may modify or make procedural match changes in the interest of safety and/or to make the event run more smoothly. The range commander will have the final say on issues of safety and range protocol.
8. Competitors must stand alone at the line of competition. No coach, leader, spotter, or other person may accompany or assist the competitor except as approved by the range officer in charge of the event. **For the junior division, a coach will be allowed on the line.** Shooters may ask the range commander for assistance.
9. Shooters may confer with their coach at their **own** discretion; not the coach/parent – **for pistol only.**
10. Scoring for all shooting events will be done at the gun club by the official score keepers on the day of the shoot. All decisions of score keepers are final. Score cards are the property of the tournament and will not be returned. Only official tournament personnel will be allowed behind the range lines and scorers tables.
 - **Challenges:** A challenge on a score must be made by the shooter only.
 - If there is a challenge on the line the range commander must be notified & range commander will mark the target.
 - **If a challenge occurs once the target has been removed from the line there will be a \$3.00 fee per occurrence. Challenges must be made at the scorers table by the shooter. If the challenge is successful the fee will be returned. If the challenge is unsuccessful the fee will not be returned to the shooter. In the event of a challenge an independent judge will be used.**
11. **Participants must show proof of Hunter Safety Course completion prior to participating in any .22 Rifle event.**
12. At the end of each event rifles, pistols and bows will be re-cased and ammunition stored properly.
13. Clark County is not responsible for loss or theft.
14. No targets will be handed out at the invitational.
15. Cold weather protection will be allowed but not extra padded gloves. Range commander decision is final.
16. No alcohol or smoking allowed on premises.
17. Competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship at all times.

MATCH RULES

.22 RIFLE

(Intermediate or Senior Divisions - must be DNR Hunter Safety Certified)

1. Each shooter will fire three positions: prone, kneeling and standing, in that order, at 50 feet.
2. 10 shots at each target for a total of 30 shots. Time limit is 10 minutes per position to shoot.
3. Standard 10 bull A17 targets will be used. 10 minute sight-in is allowed in the first position only.
4. Rifles must be plugged or otherwise prepared so they may be loaded and fired in a single fashion only. Actions must be able mechanically to be held open until ready to fire. A wooden block may be used for this purpose. Semi-automatic rifles not so modified will not be allowed on the range.

RANGE COMMANDER WILL INSPECT!

5. No magnified sights are permitted.
6. Rifles capable of firing standard or high velocity .22 long rifle ammunition are acceptable. Rifles may be modified by adjusting stock length only. **No modifications after practice round.** Shooters will provide their own ammunition.
7. Slings are allowed for all kneeling and prone positions. Kneeling rolls are allowed for the kneeling position. Slings are not allowed in the standing position.
8. No shooting jackets or other shootings aids attached to the rifle or shooter, except as noted above, are allowed.
9. Adaptation for physically challenged shooters must be approved by the county shooting sports project committee and range commander prior to the event.
10. The range commander decision is final.

MATCH RULES

PELLET AIR RIFLE

(Plinker, Sporter & Unlimited), 3 position

1. Each shooter will fire from 3 positions: prone, standing, and kneeling at 10 meters (33 feet). 10 shots at each target for a total of 30 shots. Shooter must be in the proper position while shooting.
2. Time limit is 10 minutes per position to shoot.
3. All targets are the standard NRA Ar-5/10. 10 minute sight-in is allowed in the first position only.
4. Shooters provide their own ammunition; target grade pellets are allowed. Ammunition must be pellets of caliber .177 only.
5. Ten pellets must be counted before each scoring position is shot.
6. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single fashion only.

7. No magnified sights allowed. Only sights manufactured for the air rifle are permitted. No adjustable iris or aperture may be used in the front or rear sights.
8. Slings are allowed for all kneeling and prone positions. Kneeling rolls are allowed for the kneeling position only. Slings are not allowed in the standing position.
9. Please refer to attached list of air rifle classifications for 2006.

Plinker Open Sights – see attached listing. Additional air rifles will be added to this list.

Plinker Aperture Sights – see attached listing. Additional air rifles will be added to this list.

Sporter Open Sights – see attached listing. Additional air rifles will be added to this list.

Sporter Aperture Sights (only sights manufactured for and sold with Sporter Air Rifles are permitted) – see attached listing. Additional air rifles will be added to this list.

Unlimited / Precision – see attached listing. Additional air rifles will be added to this list.

10. No shooting jackets, shooting gloves or other shooting aides attached to the rifle or shooter, except as noted above, are allowed.
11. Adaptation for physically challenged shooters must be approved by the county shooting sports project committee and range commander prior to the event.
12. Competitors must stand alone at the line of competition. No coach, leader, spotter, or other person may accompany or assist the competitor except as approved by the range officer in charge of the event. You must charge your own air rifle.
13. The range commander decision is final.

A coach will only be allowed on the line for Junior Division prior to shooting and after shooting is completed.

MATCH RULES

ARCHERY

1. Junior competitors will shoot at 10 yards - 60 arrows. Intermediate competitors will shoot at 15 yards - 60 arrows. Senior competitors will shoot at 20 yards - 60 arrows. Ten (10) practice shots will be allowed with a time limit of 4 minutes per round.
2. Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.
3. All types of bows (except footbows and crossbows) are permitted, i.e., longbows, recurves and compounds.

Barebow Any long bow, recurve, or compound bow without sights, stabilizers, or mechanical release. Just a plain bow. Can use glove, finger tab, or arm guard.

Bow without Release Can use pin and magnified sights and stabilizers. No releases and no laser sights

Freestyle Can use sights, stabilizers and releases. Anything goes.

4. All scoring will be done by the scoring judge. Any arrow or target touched before scoring will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero.
5. Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must **touch** the scoring ring to score the higher value.
6. Bounce outs or pass throughs will be scored only if the judge can unquestionably determine the point of impact; otherwise, these will be reshot at the end of the round.
7. Time limit 4 minutes per round (5 arrows).
8. No coaching or spotting allowed. Archers must adjust their own equipment on the line without any help. Parents or coaches are not allowed to assist.
9. Equipment repairs needing assistance are permitted but limited. Archer must go off the line to do repair. Repair is limited to one time only and not to exceed 15 minutes.
10. NAA whistle commands will be used

Two Blasts Archers to the shooting line

One Blasts Begin shooting

Three Blasts Walk forward and get your arrows

Four or more Blasts **STOP SHOOTING IMMEDIATELY** and put your arrows in your quiver

11. The range commander decision is final.

MATCH RULES

AIR PISTOL

1. The air pistol competition will be held at 10 meters.
2. All shooters will use the one hand hold.
3. Pistol may be CO2, spring, or pump.
4. Pistols must be open sighted. No scopes or aperture sights allowed.
5. Caliber must be .177.
6. Shooting will be done single shot.
7. Targets to be used are NRA licensed B40/4.
8. Shooters may step off the line to rest if the pistol is unloaded and laid on the table.
9. Shooters may confer with their coach at their **own** discretion; not the coach's.
10. Course of fire: 5 minutes for unlimited sighters
 45 minutes to fire 40 shots on 8 bulls
 5 shots on each bull
11. **NRA International pistol** rules govern anything not covered.
11. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain, or enrollment dictates.
13. The range commander decision is final.

EVENT TIE-BREAKERS

Air Rifle, .22 Rifle and Archery

To determine award placings (in order of application)

1. Number of 10's or X's
2. The first hit 10
3. The first hit 9
4. The first hit 8

Continue following pattern (first hit 7, 6, etc.) until tie is broken

MATCH RULES

.177 CALIBER AIR RIFLE SILHOUETTE

Most shooters will have their air rifle sighted in for the 10 meter event. Since time does not allow one to resight for the three other silhouette distances, know your pellet drop at each of the distances.

No slings or other artificial support may be used. There will be 40 shots total.

1. Two Classes: Refer to classification pages
2. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain, or enrollment dictates.
3. NRA silhouette rules are used as guidelines; however, they are adapted toward 4-H goals and philosophies.
4. All are shot from a standing position with no help from slings or supports of any kind.
5. Iron sights only (no scopes), no slings.
6. 40 shots, 2 relays of five at each of the four distances.
7. Distances:

Chicken	10 yards
Pig	15 yards
Turkey	20 yards
Ram	25 yards
8. Target size — Standard Air Rifle (one tenth high power rifle size)

Chicken	1 1/2" high
Pig	1 5/8" high
Turkey	2 5/8" high
Ram	3" high
9. Time — 5 minutes allowed per bank of five (1 min./shot).
10. Targets must be fired in sequence (first shot, first target, etc.) left to right.
11. Each shooter **must** bring an adult scorer to the firing line.
12. No coaching on the line. **Any coaching detected on the line by the range commander will result in immediate disqualification.**
13. Ties will be broken by:

1 st	number of rams
2 nd	number of turkeys
3 rd	number of pigs
4 th	first hit ram left to right
5 th	first hit turkey left to right
6 th	first hit pig left to right
7 th	first hit chicken left to right
14. Physically challenged accommodation's must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.

MATCH RULES

HUNTER / STANDARD .22 SILHOUETTE

Open to intermediate and senior level only. Must have DNR Hunter Safety certificates.

1. Two classes

Hunter	Weighs no more than 8 ½ pounds & minimum trigger pull is 2 pounds.
Unlimited	Weighs up to 10 ½ pounds
2. Iron sights or scopes are allowed.
3. All are shot from a standing position with no help from slings or supports of any kind.
4. You shoot 40 rounds, 10 rounds (2 banks) at each of 4 animals.
5. You have a total of 5 minutes per 2 banks or 2 ½ minutes per bank.
6. Distances:

Chicken	40 yards
Pig	60 yards
Turkey	77 yards
Ram	100 yards
7. Targets:

Chicken	2 ½" tip to beak by 2 ¼" top to bottom
Pig	4 ½" wide by 3" tall
Turkey	4" wide by 4 ½" tall
Ram	6 ½" wide by 5" tall
8. Targets must be fired in sequence (first shot, first target, etc.) left to right.
9. Each shooter **must** bring an adult scorer to the firing line.
10. No coaching on the line. **Any coaching on the line detected by the range commander will result in immediate disqualification.**
11. Ties will be broken by:

1 st	number of rams
2 nd	number of turkeys
3 rd	number of pigs
4 th	first hit ram left to right
5 th	first hit turkey left to right
6 th	first hit pig left to right
7 th	first hit chicken left to right
12. Physically challenged accommodation's must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
13. The range commander decision if final.

RANGE COMMANDS

Air Rifle and Smallbore Rifle

- I. **Shooters To The Line (5 - 10 minutes)**
 - This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to the shooting line
 - Firearms are uncased at the shooting line
 - Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range
 - Firearms are not handled

- II. **Preparation Time Has Started (5 - 10 minutes)**
 - Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position
 - May handle firearm with **no** ammo
 - Fingers outside of trigger guard

- III. **Is The Line Ready?**
 - Ready on the Left - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes continue
 - Ready on the Right - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes continue
 - The Line is Ready

- IV. **Shooters Load Your Firearm**
 - Single load **only**
 - **DO NOT FIRE**

- V. **Commence To Fire**
 - Fire designated rounds
 - When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range

- VI. **Cease Fire**
 - Muzzle down range, action open and **LAY FIREARMS DOWN**
 - It may mean:
 1. Problem on the line
 2. That particular discipline or round is over
 3. A new set of targets
 4. Examine your targets down range
 5. Range is unsafe

- VII. **Is The Line Clear?**
 - If you hear a “no”, see what the problem is

- VIII. **Range Is Closed**
 - Shooter cases the firearm, picks up their equipment & paraphernalia, removes it from firing line
