EVENTS	Progressive-Position Air Pistol Competition in all five position categories. 40 shots total at 10 meters.
TIME	First relay starts at 9:00 A.M. After entries are received all shooters will receive their individual relay start time. Each relay is allocated 90 minutes.
EQUIPMENT	This is an open competition.
COMPETITION OPEN TO	The competition is open to all who will not reach their 21 st birthday by December 31, 2007. It is not necessary to be a 4-H member or a member of any other group to enter this competition.
RULES	The Progressive-Position Pistol Provisional Rules will apply. The wearing of eye protection is required.
AWARDS	First, Second and Third Place awards will be given in the combined supported, Two-handed and One-handed Positions (for a total of nine awards).
ENTRY FEE	The entry fee is \$15.00

THERE ARE FIVE PPP POSITIONS AUTHORIZED

YOUTH BASIC SUPPORTED – Maximum age is Nine. Shooter may be seated or standing up, at his or her choice – may use supporting material, such as boxes, duffel bags, bean bags, or sand bags, on the table or bench - arm must be fully extended, with sights at eye level – the non-firing hand may provide support for the firing hand or butt of the pistol – shooter may rest any part of either or both hands and forearms and the pistol, including the barrel, on the supporting material.

BASIC SUPPORTED – Maximum age is Twelve. Shooter may be seated or standing up, at his or her choice – may use supporting material, such as boxes, duffel bags, bean bags, or sand bags, on the table or bench – arm must be fully extended, with the sights at eye level – the non-firing hand may provide support for the firing hand or butt of the pistol – shooter may rest the butt of the pistol on the supporting material.

ADVANCED SUPPORTED – Maximum age is Fifteen. Shooter may be seated or standing up, at his or her choice – may use supporting material, such as boxes, duffel bags, bean bags, or sand bags, on the table or bench – arm must be fully extended, with the sights at eye level – the non-firing hand may provide support for the firing hand or butt of the pistol- shooter may rest his or her elbows on the supporting material.

TWO-HANDED – Minimum age is Ten. Shooter must shoot from a standing position, with the pistol held with both hands – the pistol must be supported entirely by the strength of the shooter – no artificial support of any kind is allowed – shooting arm must be fully extended, with sights at eye level – non-firing hand will be used to provide support for the firing hand – the support hand may contact any part of the shooting hand and wrist – it may also make incidental contact with the pistol from a point approximately one inch forward of the trigger guard rearward.

ONE-HANDED – Minimum age is Thirteen. Shooter must shoot from a standing position, with the pistol held with only one hand – the pistol must be supported entirely by the strength of the shooter – no artificial support of any kind is allowed – shooting arm must be extended, with the sights at eye level – non-firing hand and arm may not contact any part of the firing hand or arm.
