

BB Gun

1. Course of Fire

- Each shooter will fire from four (4) positions: prone, sitting, kneeling and standing at 5 meters (16 ½ feet)
10 shots will be fired from each position for a total of 40 shots
- 2. Time limit is 10 minutes per position
- 3. Targets are the standard NRA 5 meter BB gun target. AR4/10
- 4. Sight-in shots are unlimited during the 10-minute sight in period. All sight in will be done from prone position.
- 5. Ammunition is provided by the shooter.
- 6. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only.
- 7. Sights – peep and open sights are allowed. No magnified sights and no eye cups.
- 8. Slings are allowed in all positions. Kneeling rolls are allowed in kneeling position only.
- 9. BB Guns – Any shoulder held smooth bore BB gun with metallic sights – - Generally the Daisy 499 is used.
- 10. Clothing – Ordinary sports or casual clothing must be worn. No shooting jackets or shooting gloves.
- 11. Adaptation for physically challenged shooters must be approved by the county shooting sports committee prior to the event.
- 12. Coaching allowed in the Junior age division only. This is being allowed as a safety concern for the young shooters.

Pellet Air Rifle (Plinker, Sporter and Unlimited) 3-Position

- 1. Rifles must be cased at all times both on and off range until range commander gives instruction to uncase.
- 2. Each shooter will fire from three (3) positions: prone, kneeling, and standing at 10 meters (33 feet). 10 shots at each target for a total of 30 shots. Shooter must be in proper position while shooting.
- 3. Time limit of 10 minutes per position. 10-minute sight-ins before the first position only.
- 4. Targets are the standard NRA AR5/10.
- 5. Shooters provide their own ammunition. Ammunition will be pellets of .177 caliber only.
- 6. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only.
- 7. Iron sights only. No magnified sights allowed.

8. Slings are allowed in all positions. Kneeling rolls are allowed for the kneeling position only.
9. No shooting jackets, shooting gloves or other shooting aids attached to the rifle or shooter, except as noted above, are allowed.
10. Adaptation for physically challenged shooters must be approved by the county shooting sports project committee prior to the event.
11. For junior shooters only, a helper may be allowed on the line. This is being allowed as a safety concern for the young shooters.
12. Plinker class is any rifle built in the USA and less than \$100 retail value.
13. Sporter class is any rifle built in the USA and cost less than \$200 retail value. Example: Daisy 853.
14. Unlimited class may use any rifle. Example: Daisy 753 or Daisy 853 with a 753 sight, Daisy 888, Crossman Challenger 2000 or any other .177 caliber air rifle.

Air Pistol

Shooting will be done one-handed, unsupported from behind a table positioned at the firing line. All shooting will be done in a single-shot fashion. Distance is 10 meters.

Pistols

Any pistol of 0.177 caliber only and with open sights will be allowed. Pistols may be powered by CO₂ cartridge, spring or pneumatic pump. Targets will be the NRA B40/4.

Range Procedure:

After all competitors are in position they will be given up to 10 minutes for preparation, during which they may uncase the pistol and set up for the match. Pistols must always point down range. Up to 10 minutes will be allowed for an unlimited number of sighters. Targets will be viewed and clean targets hung. Shooters will be allowed up to 15 minutes to shoot 10 shots at each bull. Shooters will be given the opportunity to view without touching in between rounds. Pistols must be cased at all times when not on range.

Archery

Archery Recurve Barebow

Any recurve bow with no accessories or markings other than originally shipped from the factory.

Archery Recurve Unlimited

Any recurve. Any accessories.

Archery Compound Barebow

Any compound bow with no accessories or markings other than originally shipped from the factory.

Archery Compound Limited

Any compound. Fixed pin sights only. Finger tabs, gloves only. No mechanical releases. Stabilizers 12 inches long or less may be used.

Archery Compound Unlimited

Open to all types of sights, stabilizers and releases.

No Crossbows

Target or field points only

Do not touch any arrows prior to being scored or arrow may be counted as a zero.

For Junior shooters only, a helper may be allowed on line. This is being allowed as a safety concern for the younger shooters.

TARGET ARCHERY

Junior	10 yards.....	30 arrows
Intermediate	15 yards.....	40 arrows
Senior.....	20 yards.....	40 arrows

Standard NFAA Target will be used.

3-D ARCHERY

Junior	20 shots
Intermediate	40 shots
Senior.....	40 Shots

Shooter will enter according to age as of Jan 1, 2003.

RANGE COMMANDS
Air Rifle and Small-bore Rifle

1. **SHOOTERS TO THE LINE (5-10 MINUTES):**
 - This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to the shooting line.
 - Firearms are uncased at the shooting line.
 - Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range.
 - Actions Open.
 - Firearms are not handled.
2. **PREPARATION TIME HAS STARTED (5-10 MINUTES):**
 - Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position.
 - May handle firearm with no ammo.
 - Fingers outside of trigger guard.
3. **LINE CHECK:**
 - Ready on the left – If answer is no, give more time: if yes, continue
 - Ready on the right - If answer is no, give more time: if yes, continue
4. **SHOOTERS LOAD YOUR FIREARM:**
 - Single Load Only!
 - Do Not Fire!!!!
5. **IS THE LINE READY?**
 - Ready on the left.
 - Ready on the right.
 - The line is ready.
6. **COMMENCE FIRING**
 - Fire designated rounds only.
 - When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range.
7. **CEASE FIRE:**
 - Action open, safety on, muzzle down range, and lay firearms down!!!
 - It may mean:
 - A. Problem on the line
 - B. That round, or event, is over
 - C. A new set of targets
 - D. Check your targets down range.
 - E. Range is unsafe.
8. **IS THE LINE CLEAR?**
 - If someone says no, see what the problem is!
9. **RANGE IS CLOSED:**
 - Shooters case the firearm, pick up equipment and remove it from the firing line
 - Absolutely no handling of uncased firearms!
