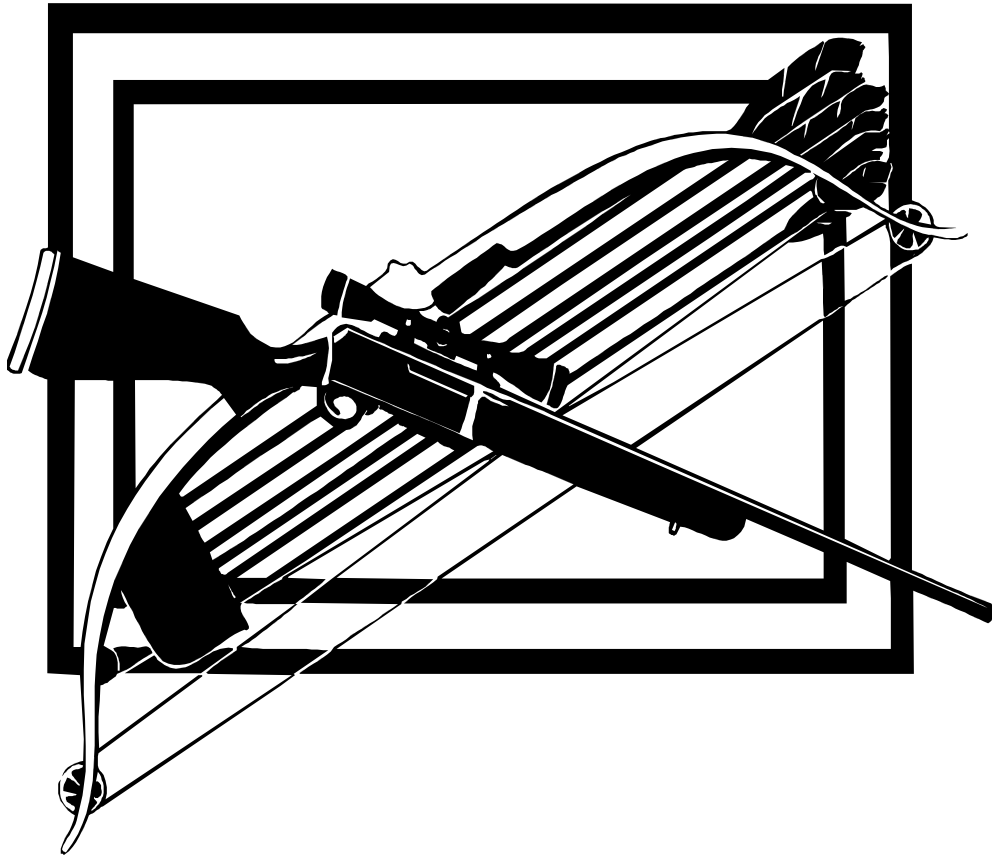

PROCEDURES & SUMMARY RULES

GENERAL RULES

1. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or registration dictates.
2. The range commander may modify or make procedural match changes in the interest of safety and/or to make the event run more smoothly. The Range Commander will have the final say on issues of safety and range protocol.
3. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Match Director.
4. To be eligible to participate in this Shooting Sports meet, contestants must be enrolled as a 4-H Shooting Sports project member and have met the criteria set by their county Shooting Sports Committee for the disciplines they are entering.
5. Three competition classes are recognized: Junior competitors – age 8 – 11, Intermediate competitors – ages 12 – 14, and Senior competitors – ages 15 – 19. Ages are as of the day of the meet. Competitors must be at least 12 years old to participate in powder burning events, and must provide their DNR Hunter Safety Certification number when registering.
6. All competitors must be able to compete effectively in a safe manner. Participants must provide proper eye and ear protection (i.e. earmuffs and /or earplugs) for powder burning events and eye protection for air pistol and air rifle. Eye protection is recommended but not required for archery. (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
7. Range Commanders have the right to deny use of unsafe equipment on the range. Inspection stickers will be placed on all firearms and bows before competitors may take their place on the shooting line.
8. Contestants are responsible for providing their own equipment, including ammunition and arrows.
9. All guns must be in a carry case except when preparing for use at the range and during competition.
10. Iron sights will include open, peep and fiber optic sights. Scopes should be set to a maximum power of 10x. No laser sights are allowed.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

.22 Caliber Silhouette
For 12 year olds and older

1. Classes:
 - Spoter Class The rifle cannot weigh more than 7½ lbs. and must have a trigger pull of at least 2 lbs.
 - Target Class There shall be no restrictions on barrel length or overall weight of the rifle. Thumb hole stocks are not allowed.
2. Two events will be shot. Iron sights (open or peep) and scope sights. Scopes must be set at a **maximum power of 10X, NO laser sights.**
3. Only rifles of .22 caliber are acceptable, ammunition will be of standard of high velocity only. **NO magnum.22, hypervelocity, or jacketed ammunition**
4. All competition shots are from the off-hand position, in either the Olympic or military style. **NO** artificial supports.
5. Course of fire consists of 20 shots at silhouettes. Each round will consist of:
 - A. 5 chickens at 40 yds
 - B. 5 pigs at 60 yds
 - C. 5 turkeys at 77 yds
 - D. 5 rams at 100 yds.
6. The number of rounds, distances and size of targets may vary depending on the needs of the event, facilities and equipment available. Such determination will be made by the match director and a range master.
7. Time limits: 5 minutes will be allowed to fire 5 shots, one shot at each silhouette in banks of five.
8. Scoring is based on one point for each silhouette knocked down in proper sequence. Competitors must fire at targets in sequence, beginning left and progressing to the right. **NO Hits** are allowed for targets fired out of sequence. NRA silhouette scoring rules are used.
9. Each shooter may have one coach at the firing line who may have a scope or binoculars and advise the shooter where shots are going, keep time or otherwise advise. The coach may not touch the shooter or any equipment after the shooter assumes a position on the firing line.
10. Ties will be broken by:
 - 1st number of rams
 - 2nd number of turkeys
 - 3rd number of pigs
 - 4th first hit ram left to right
 - 5th first hit turkey left to right
 - 6th first hit pigs left to right
 - 7th first hit chickens left to right
11. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
12. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

3 Position - .22 Caliber Rifle
For 12 year olds and older

1. Classes:
 - Sporter Class: The rifle cannot weigh more than 7 ½ lbs. Sights (including open and peep) must have a trigger pull of at least 2 lbs.
 - Target Class: There shall be no restrictions on barrel length or overall weight of the rifle. Thumb hole stocks are not allowed
2. Each shooter will fire from three positions: prone, standing and kneeling in that order at 50 feet.
3. 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots.
4. Targets are a standard NRA, A-17, 10-bull target.
5. Time limit is 10 minutes per position, one minute per shot.
6. Sighting-in is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only. The shooter inspects targets after the sight-in period.
7. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only Actions must be mechanically able to be held open until ready to fire. A block may be used for this purpose. Semi-automatic rifles not so modified will not be allowed on the range.
8. No magnified sights are permitted unless a separate class is offered for them.
9. .Only factory loaded ,22 caliber short, long or long rifle rim fire cartridges, **no hot loads**, i.e. "Stingers".
10. Slings are allowed in the prone and kneeling positions. Slings are not allowed in the standing position.
11. Kneeling rolls are allowed,
12. In the sporter class no shooting jackets are allowed, no shooting aids may be attached to the rifle or shooter except as noted above.
13. Shooters must provide their own ammunition, standard or high velocity is allowed.
14. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Rifle Director.
15. No coaching while the shooter is at the line.
16. Tie breakers: Ties will be broken with the most number of "tens," most number of "nines," most number of "eights," etc. Second tiebreakers will be the first "ten" hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
17. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.
18. .Shooting blocks/shell holders are allowed on the line.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

3-Position Air Rifle

1. Classes:
 - Plinker Class is any rifle that costs less than \$100 retail value.
 - Sporter Class is any air rifle that cost less than \$200 retail value e.g., Daisy 853.
 - Unlimited Sporter Class is any air rifle (e.g., Daisy 753, Daisy 853 with a 753 sight, Daisy 888, or a Crossman Challenger 2000.
 - Precision Class as defined by the National Rifle Association rules*.
2. Each shooter will fire from 3 positions. Prone, Standing and Kneeling, in that order, at 10 meters (33 feet).
3. Sporter, Unlimited and Precision Classes will shoot 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots. Plinker Class will shoot 5 shots at each position for a total of 15 shots.
4. Targets are the standard NRA AR-5/10 for the Sporter, Unlimited and Precision classes. Plinker class will use the single bull TQ 18 Targets.
5. Firing Time is limited to 10 minutes for position (1 minute per shot).
6. Sighting is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only.
7. Shooters provide their own ammunition .177 caliber only.
8. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only.
9. Slings are allowed in the prone and kneeling position only, slings are not allowed in the standing position.
10. .Kneeling rolls are allowed.
11. No coaching on the line.
12. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
13. Tiebreakers: Ties will be broken with the most number of "tens," most number of "nines," most number of "eights," etc. Second tiebreakers will be the first "ten" hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
14. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.
15. Shooting blocks/shell holders are allowed on the line.

State Tournament Rules**

Air Pistol

1. The air pistol competition will be held at 10 meters.
2. Junior shooters will use the one- or two-hand hold; intermediate and senior shooters will use the one-hand hold.
3. Pistol may be CO₂, spring or pump.
4. Pistols must be open sighted.
5. Caliber must be .177.
6. .Shooting will be done single shot.
7. Targets to be used are NRA licensed B40.
8. Shooters may confer with their coach at their own discretion, NOT the coach's.
9. Course of fire:
5 minutes for unlimited sighters
30 minutes to fire 20 shots on 4 bulls
5 shots on each bull
10. NRA **International Pistol** rules govern anything not covered.
11. Tiebreakers: ties will be broken with the most number of "tens," the most number of "nines," the most number of "eights," etc. The second tiebreaker will be the first "ten" hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
12. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

Air Rifle Silhouette

1. Two Classes:
Sporter Class: Daisy 853 and lower
Unlimited Class: Any rifles meeting "rule five"
2. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.
3. NRA silhouette rules are used as guidelines; however, they are adapted toward 4-H goals and philosophies.
4. All competition shots are from the off-hand position, in either Olympic or military style.
5. Iron sights only (no scopes) no slings.
6. 40 shots; 2 relays of five at each of the four distances.
7. Distances:
Chicken ----- 10 yards
Pig----- 15 yards
Turkey----- 20 yards
Ram----- 25 yards
8. Target size – Standard Air Rifle (one-tenth high power rifle size)
Chicken ----- 1 1/2" high
Pig ----- 1 5/8" high
Turkey----- 2 5/8" high
Ram----- 3" high
9. Time – 5 minutes allowed per bank of five (1 min/shot).
10. Targets must be fired in sequence (first shot, first target, etc.) left to right.
11. Each shooter should bring an adult scorer to the firing line.
12. Ties will be broken by:
1st number of rams
2nd number of turkeys
3rd number of pigs
4th first hit ram left to right
5th first hit turkey left to right
6th first hit pig left to right
7th first hit chicken left to right
13. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

Muzzleloading
for 12 year olds and older

1. **Course of Fire:** A single practice sighting shot will be fired at 25 yards, followed by five (5) shots for record. Time allowed will be 30 minutes. Following the 25-yard phase of competition, five (5) shots for record will be fired at 50 yards. No practice/sighting shots at 50 yards. Time allowed will be 30 minutes. A total of eleven (11) shots will be fired – one (1) practice/sighting shot and ten (10) for record shots. A fouling shot, preceding the one practice sighting shot, will be allowed.
2. **Target:** The 25-yard competition phase will utilize the National Rifle Association 6 bull A-51 target. The 50-yard competition phase will utilize the NRA B-19 pistol target. The five (5) shots for record will be fired upon this single-bull target.
3. **Shooting Position:** All shooting will be done from the offhand (standing) position without the aid of a sling or other artificial support. Either the military or Olympic stance is acceptable.
4. **Capping, Snapping, Firing:** All loading will be done at the loading bench located behind the firing line. All capping, snapping of caps, flash pan charging, and firing will take place at the firing line.
5. **Propellant:** Propellant to be only Black Powder, Pyrodex, or any other NMLRA approved Black Powder substitute of appropriate granulation for your rifle. A powder measure, separate from the powder container, must be used when charging. No open containers of powder will be allowed on the loading benches. Load charge must be only what is considered light to moderate for your rifle.
6. **Ammunition:** Projectiles will be patched round ball or lubricated bullet. Plastic patching or synthetic fabric patching may not be used with the round ball. Any safe, non-corrosive lubrication may be used. **NO sabots allowed.**
7. **Firearms:** Side hammer or in-line percussion cap rifles or smooth bore shoulder arms that load from the muzzle and which are not a break-open type firearm may be used. Ignition must be by the old type percussion cap, which fits over the nipple. Primers may not be used for ignition. Flintlocks will be allowed.
8. **Sights:** Any metallic sight combination (iron sights) open and/or peep may be used. No telescopic sights.
9. **Optical Equipment:** Spotting scopes are not permitted. Hand-held binoculars might be placed on the bench as an aid in viewing targets.

The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

Trap

For 12 year olds and older

1. No shells longer than 2 ¾" except .410 gauge. Traploads only; magnum, or baby magnum loads, are **not permitted**
2. Shooters will fire from the 16-yard line.
3. Both divisions will shoot two rounds of 25 clays each for the event. **NO practice rounds will be thrown.**
4. Shots sizes 7½ to 9 only.
5. In the event of ties, awards shall be decided on the basis of the longest run of hits in the total event beginning with the first target hit. If a tie remains, a ten clay shoot-off will be shot; 2 clays per station. Should this not resolve the tie, the event will be decided by a station-by-station (1 shot) "sudden death".
6. **Amateur Trap Shooters Association** rules govern, except for the rules noted above, and when the Match Director alters rules to allow for the smooth operation of the shoot.

**Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports
State Tournament Rules**

Archery

1. Junior competitors will shoot at 10 yards – 60 arrows. Intermediate competitors will shoot at 15 yards – 60 arrows. Senior competitors will shoot at 20 yards – 60 arrows.
Two practice ends
2. Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.
3. All types of bows (except footbows and crossbows) are permitted, i.e. longbows, recurves and compounds
Barebow: Any long bow, recurve or compound bow **without** sights, stabilizers or mechanical releases. Just a plain bow. Can use glove, finger tab and arm guard.
Bow with one Aid: Can use one aid (sights, stabilizers or release, etc.) No laser sites permitted.
Bow with two or more Aids: Can use two or more aids (sight, stabilizer, release, etc.) No laser sights permitted.
4. All scoring will be done by the scoring judge. Any arrow or target touched before scoring, will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero.
5. Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must touch the scoring ring to score the higher value. Any questionable call will immediately be determined by range commander. The range commander's decision is final.
6. Bounce outs or pass through will be scored only if the judge can unquestionably determine the point of impact, otherwise, these will be reshot at the end of the round.
7. Time limit is 5 minutes per end (5 arrows).
8. NAA whistle commands will be used.
9. NFAA single spots of 5 spot target will be used. Shooters must choose single or 5 spots at registration time.
10. Coaches will be allowed to assist in repairing equipment (15 minutes time limit will be allowed for repairs if needed) but are not allowed to make tuning adjustments during the competition.
11. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Archery Commander.
12. Event tiebreakers will be most number of X's, 2nd tiebreaker will be most X's per end.

RANGE COMMANDS
Air Rifle and Smallbore Rifle

I. Shooters to the Line (5-10 minutes)

- This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to the shooting line.
- Firearms are uncased at the shooting line.
- Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range.
- Firearms are not handled.

II. Preparation Time Has Started (5-10 minutes)

- Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position.
- May handle firearm with no ammo.
- Fingers outside of trigger guard.

III. Is The Line Ready?

- Ready on the Left - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- Ready on the Right - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- The Line is Ready.

IV. Shooters Load Your Firearm

- Single load only.
- DO NOT FIRE.

V. Commence to Fire

- Fire designated rounds.
- When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range.

VI. Cease Fire

- Muzzle down range, action open and LAY FIREARMS DOWN.
- It may mean:
 1. Problem on the line.
 2. That particular discipline or round is over.
 3. A new set of targets
 4. Examine your targets down range.
 5. Range is unsafe.

VII. Is The Line Clear?

- If you hear a "no," see what the problem is.

VIII. Range is Closed

- Shooter cases the firearm, picks up his/her equipment and paraphernalia and removes it from the firing line.
- Absolutely no handling of uncased firearm.

ARCHERY WHISTLE COMMANDS

Whistle:	Two Blasts
Verbal Command:	"Archers to the shooting line".
Meaning:	Archers pick up their bow and take their position on the shooting line. Arrows must be kept in the quiver.
Whistle:	One Blast
Verbal Command:	"Begin shooting"!
Meaning:	Archers may now take their arrows out of their quivers and begin shooting.
Whistle:	Three Blasts
Verbal Command:	"Walk forward and get your arrows."
Meaning:	Archers have completed shooting. All archers have set their bows down and are behind the waiting line. They may now go forward to pull their arrows.
Whistle:	Four or More Blasts (a series of blasts)
Verbal Command:	"STOP, STOP, STOP, STOP!" or "CEASE FIRE!"
Meaning:	Archers immediately let down and put their arrows back into the quiver. There is an emergency on the range.
