

Registration Time - Begins at 8:30 a.m. - Closes at 11:30- No Exceptions

Continuous shooting will begin at 8:30 a.m.

Note: *Please come as close to 8:30 a.m. as possible.*

To people who have to drive a long distance, you do not have to be there at 8:30 a.m., you are recommended to be there by **10:30** a.m. in order to complete the course on time.

Please try to be there as soon as you can to keep the day from getting too long. Remember that there are several events to complete. This is allowed for youth who must drive 3 ½ to 4 ½ hours.

You may start competing in any of the events as soon as you are registered. There is no set order of events. It is recommended that you get into a spot that is open as soon as possible in order to complete the day's events in a reasonable time frame.

NOTE: You should have enough time between events for a short break or lunch.

This will be a very exciting archery event with some very interesting archery courses.

Fun for the whole family.

Pellet Air Rifle (Plinker, Sporter & Freestyle), 3 position

1. Each shooter will fire from 3 positions: prone, kneeling, and standing at 10 meters (33 feet). 10 shots at each target for a total of 30 shots.
2. Time limit is 10 minutes per position.
3. Targets are the standard NRA Ar-5/10. Plinker class will use the TQ18 targets.
4. Shooters provide their own ammunition; target grade pellets are allowed. Ammunition will only be pellets of caliber .177.
5. Air rifles must be loaded and fired in a single fashion only.
6. Plinker class is any rifle built in the USA and costs less than \$100.00 retail value.
7. Sporter class is any rifle built in the USA and costs less than \$200.00 retail value. Example: Daisy 853.
8. Freestyle class is any rifle. Example: Daisy 753 or Daisy 853 with a 753 sight, or any other air pellet rifle.

Air Rifle Rules

1. Safety is the primary consideration. Each contestant must provide, and wear, eye protection for all air rifle shooting events. Any violation of safe shooting is grounds for disqualification.
2. Range officials shall check all firearms and ammunition prior to its use in competition. Unsafe equipment will not be allowed on the range.
3. Contestants are responsible for providing their own equipment, including ammunition.
4. All air rifles will be cased and unloaded until the competitor is instructed to uncage on the firing line.
5. The range commander may modify or make procedural match changes in the interest of safety and/or to make the event run more smoothly. The range commander will have the final say on issues of safety.
6. Competitors must stand alone at the line of competition. No coach, leader, spotter, or other person may accompany or assist the competitor except as approved by the range officer in charge of the event. For the junior division, a coach will be allowed on the line.
7. At the end of each event, the rifle will be recased.
8. Wood County is not responsible for loss or theft.

Archery Events

The Triple Crown format will consist of 3 different archery courses. They are:

Archery indoor target

Archery outdoor 3-D (Foam animal targets)

Archery outdoor field (Shooting at a 48" Olympic targets)

Official Rounds:

- **Archery Indoor Target**

Junior competitors will shoot at 10 yards , 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.

Intermediate competitors will shoot at 15 yards, 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows

Senior competitors will shoot at 20 yards, 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.

- **Archery 3-D Outdoor (*NO range finding devices allowed*)**

Competitors will need to estimate yardage and shoot at 3-D foam animal targets.

Junior competitors will shoot at 5-15 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 30 arrows.

Intermediate competitors will shoot at 5-25 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 30 arrows.

Senior competitors will shoot at 5-35 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 30 arrows.

- **Archery Outdoor Field**

Competitors will be shooting at the famous 48" Olympic Archery Targets.

A total of 30 arrows will be shot for the score. Two rounds of 5 arrows will be shot at each yardage.

Junior competitors will shoot at 10, 20, and 30 yards.

Intermediates competitors will shoot at 20, 30, and 40 yards.

Senior competitors will shoot at 30, 40, and 50 yards.

NOTE: The large Olympic Targets compensate for the long distance.

New for 2003

Outdoor Field Olympic Style Eliminator Round

This event will be held just prior to the awards ceremony, and should be exciting and intense for everyone!

- To qualify you must place in the top 4 scores in your age group on the outdoor field round.
- 4 Juniors at 30 yards, 4 Intermediates at 40 yards, 4 Seniors at 50 yards will compete in a shoot-out.
- 2 competitors per Olympic target shooting 3 arrows per round.
- High score will continue to the next round until the field is eliminated to 1 shooter.
- 1 winner, 1 grand trophy!

3-D Olympic Style Eliminator Round

- To qualify you must place in the top 4 scores in your age group on the 3-D round.
- 4 Juniors at 15 yards, 4 Intermediates at 20 yards, 4 Seniors at 25 yards will compete in a shoot-out.
- 2 competitors per 3-D target shooting 2 arrows per round
- High score will continue to the next round until the field is eliminated to 1 shooter.
- 1 winner, 1 grand trophy!

Technical Control and Equipment Inspection

A technical control station will be present. Each competitor will present his/her equipment and proof of entry class for inspection. This normally would follow right after registration. It is the responsibility of the archer to maintain his/her equipment within the rules. Failure to do so may result in a disqualification.

Equipment Classification

Archery Barebow

Competitors will shoot long bows, recurves, or compound bows without the aid of mechanical releases or sighting devices. (Sight brackets must be removed from bow, no peep or other string sights may be used. Must be shot using fingers.)

Archery Recurve Freestyle

Allowing any type of sights, stabilizers, or other aids.

Archery Compound Limited

Allowing the use of non-optical sights and stabilizers, no mechanical releases, must use fingers.

Archery Compound Freestyle

Allowing any use of sights, any type of stabilizers, and any type of release can be used.

Arrows

Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.

Statewide Invitational Shoot -Archery Tournament RULES

1. Arm guards are recommended as a safety measure, but not required.
2. Designated scoring personnel will do all the scoring. Any arrow or target touched before scoring will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero.
3. Bounce-outs or pass through will be scored only if the designated scorer can unquestionably determine the point of impact; otherwise, these will be re-shot at the end of the round.
4. Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must touch the scoring ring to score the higher value. The range commander will immediately determine any questionable call. The decision is final.
5. Archers are given the option to re-add their total scores with the scorekeeper when finished shooting.
6. Time limit is 4 minutes per end (5 arrows). You will receive one time limit warning.
7. Equipment failure needs to be reported to a tournament official as soon as possible. The shooter will have 15 minutes off the line to make any repairs and have two practice ends (10 arrows) prior to returning to tournament scoring. Assistance for repairs is permitted.
8. N.F.A.A. single spot or 5 spot target will be used for the indoor event. Shooters must choose single or 5 spot target face at the indoor event check-in station. No changes allowed thereafter.
9. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested on the original registration form and approved by the archery range commander.
10. Any rule infraction(s) may disqualify a participant at any time during the tournament as determined by the range commander or tournament committee chairperson
- 11. All competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship with other competitors at all times.**
12. Qualifications include being capable of competing in a safe manner without any assistance from parents, coaches, or other adults, and meeting any age restrictions for a given event.

Directions to Central Wisconsin Sportsman's Club:

From North of Marshfield off of Hwy. 97: Stadt Rd. is located off of Hwy. 97 just North of Marshfield between Hwy. T (North of Stadt) and Galvin Ave. (South of Stadt). Take Stadt Road South off of 97 and proceed 2 ³/₄ miles. Clubhouse will be on your right.

From Hwy. 10 South of Marshfield: Take Hwy. 10 East from the Hwy. 10 and 13 intersection. Proceed 3 miles to Stadt Rd. Take Stadt Rd. North off of Hwy. 10 – 3 ¹/₄ miles. Clubhouse will be on your left. Stadt Rd. is located off of Hwy. 10 between Hwy. A (West of Stadt) 1 mile, and Hwy. T (East of Stadt) 1 mile.
