PROCEDURES & SUMMARY RULES

GENERAL RULES

1. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or registration dictates.
2. The range commander may modify or make procedural match changes in the interest of safety and/or to make the event run more smoothly. The Range Commander will have the final say on issues of safety and range protocol.
3. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Match Director.
4. To be eligible to participate in this Shooting Sports meet, contestants must be enrolled as a 4-H Shooting Sports project member and have met the criteria set by their county Shooting Sports Committee for the disciplines they are entering.
5. Three competition classes are recognized: Junior competitors – age 8 (and in 3rd grade) – 11, Intermediate competitors – ages 12 – 14, and Senior competitors – ages 15 – 19. Ages for this shooting competition are as of the day of the meet. This is different from the age requirements for those qualifying for the National Invitational. Age for state qualification for the National Invitational: Participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1st of the year they are qualifying.
6. Competitors must be at least 12 years old to participate in powder burning events, and must provide their DNR Hunter Safety Certification number when registering.
7. All competitors must be able to compete effectively in a safe manner. Participants must provide proper eye and ear protection (i.e. earmuffs and /or earplugs) for powder burning events and eye protection for air pistol and air rifle. Eye protection is recommended but not required for archery. (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
8. Range Commanders have the right to deny use of unsafe equipment on the range. Inspection stickers will be placed on all firearms and bows before competitors may take their place on the shooting line.
9. Contestants are responsible for providing their own equipment, including ammunition and arrows.
10. All guns must be in a carry case except when preparing for use at the range and during competition.
11. Iron sights will include open, peep and fiber optic sights. Scopes should be set to a maximum power of 10x. No laser sights are allowed.

This competitive shoot will also be used to qualify individuals (seniors) to participate in the 2010 National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational in the following events: 1) ARCHERY RECURVE (Seniors must also participate in a FITA round at 30, 40 and 50 yards); 2) ARCHERY COMPOUND (Seniors must also participate in a FITA round at 30, 40 and 50 yards); 3) .177 AIR RIFLE; 4) .177 AIR PISTOL; 5) SMALLBORE (.22) PISTOL; 6) .22 RIFLE; 7) MUZZLELOADING (Seniors must also shoot silhouettes at 1 X 50 and 1 X 100 yards); 8) SHOTGUN (Individuals qualifying in Shotgun, who wish to participate in the 2009 National 4-H Invitational, must practice with a certified 4-H Shooting Sports Shotgun leader who will certify that the participant is able to safely participate in the 5-Stand Sporting Clays and Skeet events at least two months before going to the National 4-H Invitational event.)

4-H Shooting Sports National Invitational Qualification

Wisconsin Requirements for State 4-H Shooting Sports Team

Team members are selected annually through competitive shoots offered to 4-H members across the state. Members who meet the criteria for eligibility earn their place on the team by recording the highest scoring percentage in a discipline. Members who qualify but forfeit their National trip allow the next highest scoring individual to move up providing their scores are competitive on the National level. Teams shall be comprised of no more than four individuals. Team selection is determined in the fall by the State 4-H Shooting Sports Competition Committee.

Requirements:

1. Participants in the state qualification shoots and those representing Wisconsin 4-H at the 4-H National Invitational shall be members in good standing currently enrolled in 4-H Shooting Sports in their county.
2. The following are qualification disciplines which represent each team: Archery (compound), Archery (recurve), Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Smallbore (.22) Pistol, Muzzleloader, Shotgun, Smallbore .22 Rifle and Hunting Skills.
3. Those attending the 4-H National Invitational in the Hunting Skills discipline must participate in the State 4-H Wildlife Habitat Evaluation Program (WHEP) the same year before they attend National. Discipline qualifiers, other than Hunting Skills, must participate in the Wildlife/Ecology contest at each event where they are qualifying.
4. Age for state qualification for the National Invitational: Participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1st of the year they are qualifying (2009).
5. Age for National qualification: Participants must have passed their 14th birthday and not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1st of the year of the National.
6. The minimum number of scores for each discipline are as follow
 - Archery Compound...3 target scores, 1 animal score and 1 FITA score
 - Archery Recurve.....2 target scores, 1 animal score and 1 FITA score
 - Air Rifle.....3 target scores and 1 silhouette score
 - Air Pistol.....2 scores (one handed standing)
 - Smallbore .22 Pistol...3 scores (1 Camp Perry, 1 Slow Fire Bullseye, 1 Hunter Silhouette)
 - Smallbore .22 Rifle . 2 target scores and 2 silhouette scores
 - Muzzleloader.....1 score
 - Shotgun.....2 scores
 - Hunting Skills.....
 - 1 Archery animal score,
 - 1 .22 Rifle silhouette score,
 - 1 Shotgun score,
 - 1 Muzzleloader score,
 - 1 score from the State 4-H Wildlife Habitat Evaluation Program contest
7. Multiple qualification scores may be earned but only the highest score(s) are used.

8. Multiple scores (.22, Air Pistol, Archery) may be earned at one event but only one score per discipline is permitted. Archery scores may be earned in target, animal and FITA at the same event. (Archery compound and Archery recurve will be scored separately for qualifying.)
9. Participants who qualify for National are only eligible to attend National the year following their qualification.
10. Once you attend National you are no longer permitted to repeat in the same discipline. However, Archery compound and Archery recurve are different disciplines with different teams allowing you to qualify for a different Archery team. Any Wisconsin National Team members may continue to compete in Wisconsin's 4-H Statewide Invitational competitions after attending National Competition.
11. Participants are allowed to represent only one discipline team each year.
12. Requirements not covered here will follow the 4-H National Invitational General Rules

.22 Caliber Silhouette
For 12 year olds and older.

- 1.) Classes:
Sporter Class: The rifle cannot weigh more than 7 ½ lbs. Sights (including open and peep must have a trigger pull of at least 2 lbs.
Target Class: There shall be no restrictions on barrel length or overall weight of the rifle.
- 2.) Two events will be shot. Iron sights (open or peep) and scope sights. Scopes must be set at a **maximum power of 10X, NO laser sights.**
- 3.) Only rifles of .22 caliber are acceptable; ammunition will be of standard or high velocity only. **NO magnum .22, hypervelocity, or jacketed ammunition.**
- 4.) All competition shots are from the off-hand position, in either the Olympic or military style. **NO** artificial supports.
- 5.) Course of fire consists of 20 shots at silhouettes. Each round will consist of:
A. 5 chickens at 40 yds. C. 5 turkeys at 77 yds.
B. 5 pigs at 60 yds. D. 5 rams at 100 yds.
- 6.) The number of rounds, distances, and size of targets may vary depending on the needs of the event, facilities, and equipment available. Such determination will be made by the match director and range master.
- 7.) Time limits: 2 ½ minutes will be allowed to fire 5 shots, one shot at each silhouette in banks of five.
- 8.) Scoring is based on one point for each silhouette knocked down in proper sequence. Competitors must fire at targets in sequence, beginning left and progressing to the right. **NO Hits** are allowed for targets fired out of sequence. NRA silhouette scoring rules are used.
- 9.) Each shooter may have one coach at the firing line who may have a scope or binoculars and advise the shooter where shots are going, keep time, or otherwise advise. The coach may not touch the shooter or any equipment after the shooter assumes a position on the firing line.
- 10.) Ties will be broken by:
1st number of rams
2nd number of turkeys
3rd number of pigs
4th first hit ram left to right
5th first hit turkey left to right
6th first hit pigs left to right
7th first hit chickens left to right
- 11.) Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
- 12.) The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain, or enrollment dictates.

3-Position - .22 caliber Rifle

For 12 year olds and older.

- 1.) Classes:
Sporter Class: The rifle cannot weigh more than 7 ½ lbs. Sights (including open and peep) must have a trigger pull of at least 2 lbs.
Target Class: There shall be no restrictions on barrel length or overall weight of the rifle.
- 2.) Each shooter will fire from three positions: prone, standing, and kneeling, in that order at 50 feet.
- 3.) 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots
- 4.) Targets are a standard NRA, A-17, 10-bull target.
- 5.) Time limit is 10 minutes per position, one minute per shot.
- 6.) Sighting-in is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only. The shooter inspect targets after the sight-in period.
- 7.) Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only. Actions must be mechanically able to be held open until ready to fire. A block may be used for this purpose. Semi-automatic rifles not so modified will not be allowed on the range
- 8.) No magnified sights are permitted unless a separate class is offered for them.
- 9.) Only factory-loaded .22 caliber short, long or long rifle rim fire cartridges, **no hot loads**, i.e. “Stingers.”
- 10.) Slings are allowed for the kneeling and prone positions. Slings are not allowed in the standing position.
- 11.) Kneeling rolls are allowed.
- 12.) In the sporter class no shooting jackets are allowed, no shooting aids may be attached to the rifle or shooter except as noted above.
- 13.) Shooters must provide their own ammunition, standard or high velocity is allowed.
- 14.) Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Rifle Director.
- 15.) No coaching while the shooter is at the line.
- 16.) Tie breakers: ties will be broken with most number of “tens”, most number of “nines”, most number of “eights” etc; 2nd tiebreaker: first “ten” hit in sequence until tie is broken.
- 17.) The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain, or enrollment dictates.

- .) Each shooter will fire from 3 positions. Prone, Standing, and Kneeling, in that order, at 10 meters (33 feet).
- 3.) Sporter, Unlimited Sporter, and Precision Classes will shoot 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots. Plinker Class will shoot 5 shots at each position for a total of 15 shots.
- 4.) Targets are the standard NRA AR-5/10 for the Sporter, Unlimited Sporter, and Precision classes: Plinker class will use the single bull TQ 18 Targets.
- 5.) Firing Time is limited to 10 minutes for position (1 minute per shot).
- 6.) Sighting in is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only.
- 7.) Air rifle and ammunition shall be .177 caliber only.
- 8.) Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only.
- 9.) Slings are allowed in the prone and kneeling position only, slings are not allowed in the standing position.
- 10.) Kneeling rolls are allowed.
- 11.) No coaching on the line.
- 12.) Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
- 13.) Tiebreakers: ties will be broken with the most number of “tens”, most number of “nines”, most number of “eights” etc; 2nd tiebreakers: the first “ten” hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
- 14.) The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain, or enrollment dictates.

Air Pistol

Classes: Juniors	(9 - 11 yr)-----bench rest only
Intermediate	(12 - 14yr)-----two handed or one handed
Senior	(15 - 19yr)-----one handed

- 1.) The air pistol competition will be held at 10 meters.
- 2.) Pistol may be CO₂, spring, or pump.
- 3.) Pistols must be open sighted.
- 4.) Caliber must be .177.
- 5.) Shooting will be done single shot.
- 6.) Targets to be used are NRA licensed B40.
- 7.) Shooters may confer with their coach at their own discretion NOT the coach's discretion.
- 8.) Course of fire:

SMALLBORE PISTOL 2009 GENERAL RULES

Welcome to Smallbore Pistol Shooting!

The objective of our 4-H Shooting Sports firearms program is to teach safe handling and use of a gun, marksmanship skills so that the participant enjoys it and finds it rewarding and, perhaps most importantly, HAVE FUN!

Smallbore Pistol is a new addition to the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Program this year. **Participants will need to be at least 12 years of age and have completed Hunter Safety.** Participants and their families need to take note of the following:

Per BATE regulations, all pistol shooters under the age of 18 must have in their possession a written permission statement from their parent or guardian stating their permission to possess and fire Smallbore Pistols. In accordance with federal laws pertaining to youth and pistols (see Youth Safety Handgun Act), the National 4-H Shooting Sports Program prohibits the transportation of a pistol for any reason by a youth under 18 years of age. Arrangements must be made for an adult to transport all smallbore pistols.

The **Smallbore (.22) Handgun Parent/Guardian Authorization** (consent form) follows this update. The page contains two forms that will be used for the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Smallbore Pistol discipline. Both forms need to be signed, witnessed, and dated. One form needs to be given to the County or Club 4-H Shooting Sports Certified Pistol Leader to keep on file. The other form needs to be laminated and kept in the pistol case so the youth has access to it at every training session or pistol competition. **Youth will only be able to shoot the pistol at a 4-H event (practice or competition) after presenting the completed form when checking in to the event. We recommend keeping this form in the pistol kit being used by each youth participant. Youth will also need to present proof of completion of DNR Hunter Safety.**

Youth under the age of 18 may NOT possess a smallbore pistol without adult supervision. This includes driving themselves to the event or even walking from the parking lot into the building. Similarly, at any match, parents may not just hand the cased gun to their youth in the parking area and send them on their way to the pistol event. A parent or guardian needs to accompany the youth to and from the .22 pistol event.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION REQUIRED

You may be aware that we've required eye protection for Air Pistol. For Smallbore Pistol, ear protection will also be required. Ear plugs and/or protective muffs will do. A number of pistol instructors wear both. Please visit the hardware store, a sporting goods store or the sporting goods department at a neighborhood store to get proper hearing protection. Hearing protection is usually rated in terms of how much decibel reduction they provide. A higher number gives more protection.

SMALLBORE PISTOL EVENTS

There will be three events for Smallbore Pistol. These mirror the events run at the 4-H National Match. The events are Camp Perry Round (modified), Slow Fire and Hunter Silhouettes. Most practices will concentrate on the Camp Perry Round which will include three stages: Slow Fire, Timed Fire and Rapid Fire. The bullseye events will be shot one-handed. Silhouettes may be shot two-handed. **The Camp Perry Round (modified) and Slow Fire events will be shot at 25 yards at the August 1, 2009 Beloit 4-H Shooting Sports State Invitational.**

PISTOLS AND AMMO

Participants will need to bring their own .22 Long Rifle **non-jacketed** ammunition and pistol.

Semiautomatic pistols are easier to shoot with for most competition, mostly because you don't have to thumb cock the hammer for each shot (remember, bullseye will be shot one-handed). Good semiautos are available from Ruger, Browning, Smith & Wesson and others. Feel free to discuss your pistol choices with our instructors.

If You Are a New Shooter This Year...

Don't worry about all the talk about competition. The main part of our program is to make sure all our shooters have the fundamentals of SAFETY down, then the fundamentals of MARKSMANSHIP. This can lead to a lifetime of enjoyment in the shooting sports. I also find that if you can execute the fundamentals well with the pistol, it can improve your rifle shooting, too. The fundamentals are essentially the same. If you can do it with a pistol, using the superior support possible with a rifle is that much easier!

- Capping, Snapping, Firing:** All loading will be done at the loading bench located behind the firing line. All capping, snapping of caps, flash pan charging, and firing will take place at the firing line.
- Propellant:** Propellant to be only Black Powder, Pyrodex, or any other NMLRA approved Black Powder substitute of appropriate granulation for your rifle. A powder measure, separate from the powder container must be used when charging. No open containers of powder will be allowed on the loading benches. Load charge must be only what is considered light to moderate for your rifle.
- Ammunition:** Projectiles will be patched round ball or lubricated bullet. Plastic patching or synthetic fabric patching may not be used with the round ball. Any safe, non-corrosive lubrication may be used. **NO sabots allowed.**
- Firearms:** Side hammer or in-line percussion cap rifles or smooth bore shoulder arms that load from the muzzle and which is not a break-open type firearm may be used. Ignition must be by the old type percussion cap, which fits over the nipple. Primers may not be used for ignition. Flintlocks will be allowed.
- Sights:** Any metallic sight combination (iron sights) open and/or peep may be used. No telescopic sights.
- Optical Equipment:** Spotting scopes are not permitted. Hand held binoculars might be placed on the bench as an aid in viewing targets.
- Scoring:** The center of the ball (center shot) will be scored using a scoring overlay on the target.
- Ties:** Ties will be broken with most number of "X" The second tie breaker is the widest shot shall lose, the target with the second widest shall lose and so on.

NOTE: (Seniors and Intermediates interested in qualifying for the 2008 National 4-H Invitational must also compete in a FITA Competition using Recurve unlimited or Compound unlimited). Competitors will be shooting at the 48” Olympic FITA Archery Targets. A total of 30 arrows will be shot for the score. Two rounds of 5 arrows will be shot at each yardage. Competitors will shoot at 30, 40, and 50 yards. The large Olympic FITA Targets compensate for the long distance.

9. On a 5 spot target, the shooter may shoot the spots in any order and as many arrows into any spot as the archery desires, not to exceed 5 arrows per end.
10. NFAA single spots or 5 spot target will be used. Shooters must choose single or 5 spots at registration time.
11. No coaching allowed on line during match. (15 minute time limit will be allowed for repairs if needed, but are not allowed to make tuning adjustments during the competition.)
12. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Archery Commander.
13. Event tiebreakers will be most number of **X's**; 2nd tie breaker will be most **X's** per end.

TOP GUN TEAM
(For those 12 years old and older)

Rules are for .22 Silhouette

1. One adult & one 4-H member or Brothers, Sisters, or Brother and Sister as a team, or Father & Son, Father & Daughter, or with your Mother, Aunt, Uncle, Grand child. No limit to the number of times you shoot as a different team member. (Example: father daughter and mother and same daughter as two teams).
2. Pig silhouette at 40 meters, 146 feet, 48.7 yards standing.
3. Both shooters will use the same rifle .22 cal. Iron Sights or Scope any power you want.
4. 10 shots each, 20 points total.
5. Registration fee is \$7.00 total for the team.
6. Only 1 trophy will be given per family.
7. If there is a tie it goes to the longest straight run from the first target hit. Both shooters scores will be added together.
8. This is considered to be a family event, encouraging team work. Have fun and don't beat Mom or Dad too bad.
9. Pay at registration for this competition. Go to the Silhouette Range for any additional information.
10. If there is a tie a shoot-off will be set up by the Range Commander or Range Officer, someone not in the shoot-off. A different silhouette and yardage will be used.

RANGE COMMANDS

Air Rifle and Smallbore Rifle

I. Shooters to the Line (5-10 minutes)

- This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to the shooting line.
- Firearms are uncased at the shooting line.
- Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range.
- Firearms are not handled.

II. Preparation Time Has Started (5-10 minutes)

- Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position.
- May handle firearm with no ammo.
- Fingers outside of trigger guard.

III. Is The Line Ready?

- Ready on the Left - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- Ready on the Right - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- The Line is Ready

IV. Shooters Load Your Firearm

- Single load only.
- DO NOT FIRE.

V. Commence to Fire

- Fire designated rounds.
- When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range.

VI. Cease Fire

- Muzzle down range, action open and LAY FIREARMS DOWN.
- It may mean:
 1. Problem on the line.
 2. That particular discipline or round is over.
 3. A new set of targets
 4. Examine your targets down range.
 5. Range is unsafe.

VII. Is The Line Clear?

- If you hear a "no," see what the problem is.

VIII. Range is Closed

- Shooter cases the firearm, picks up his/her equipment and paraphernalia and removes it from the firing line.
- Absolutely no handling of uncased firearm.

ARCHERY WHISTLE COMMANDS

Whistle: Two Blasts

Verbal Command: "Archers to the shooting line."

Meaning: Archers pick up their bow and take their position on the shooting line. Arrows must be kept in the quiver.

Whistle: One Blast

Verbal Command: "Begin shooting!"

Meaning: Archers may now take their arrows out of their quivers and begin shooting.

Whistle: Three Blasts

Verbal Command: "Walk forward and get your arrows."

Meaning: Archers have completed shooting. All archers have set their bows down and are behind the waiting line. They may now go forward to pull their arrows.

Whistle: Four or More Blasts (a series of blasts)

Verbal Command: "STOP, STOP, STOP, STOP!" or "CEASE FIRE!"

Meaning: Archers immediately let down and put their arrows back into the quiver. There is an emergency on the range.

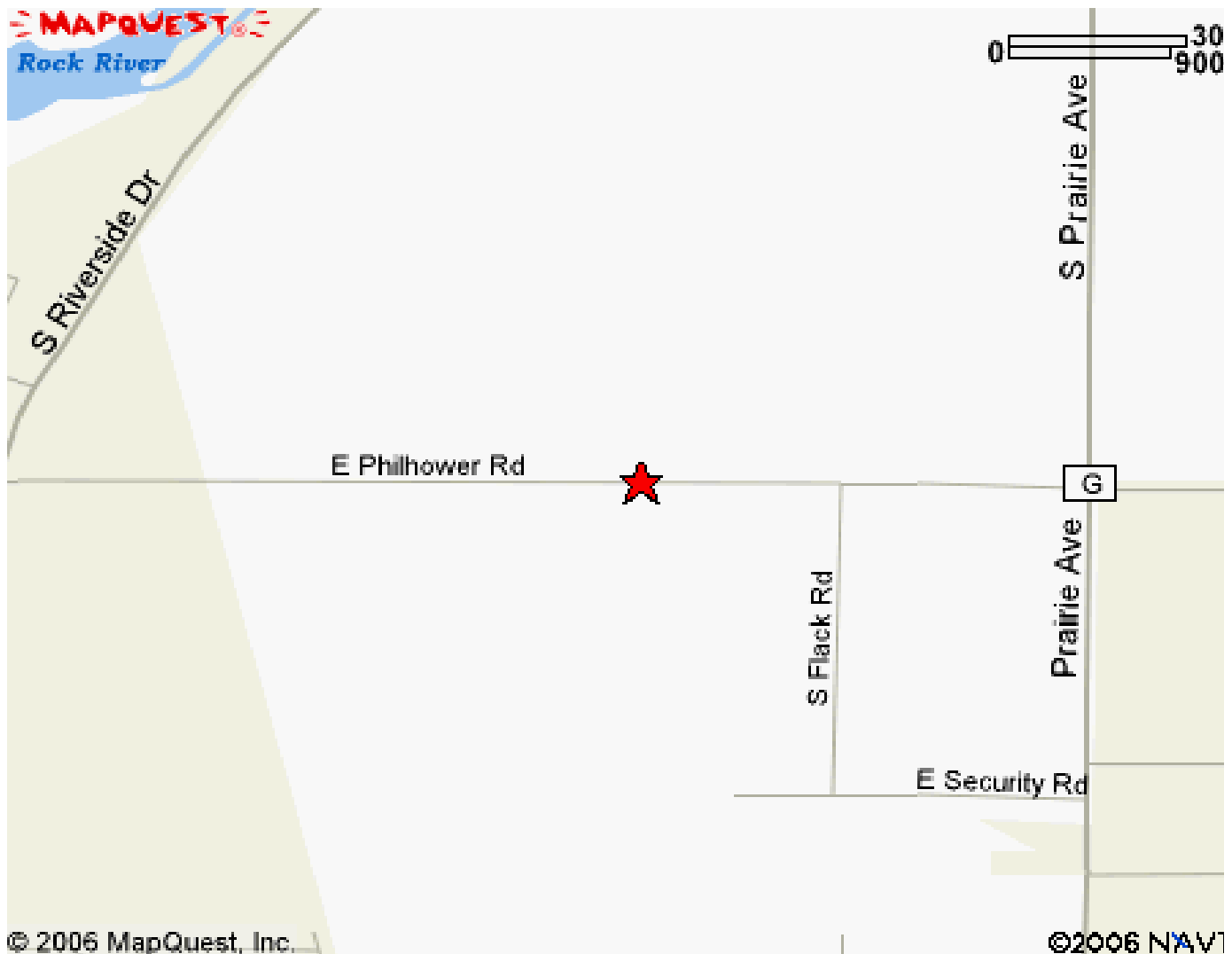
