This event is open to all 4-H members in good standing with their local club. Registered shooters must be ages 8 (third grade) and 19 years of age. Please check event listing for any age restrictions.

Schedule of Events:

June 19, 2010 – Rain or Shine, dress for weather.

7:30 a.m. registration begins, competition follows.

The awards follow completion of competitive events.

Registration Time - Begins at 7:30 a.m. - Closes at 1:30 p.m.

Continuous shooting will begin at 8:00 a.m. Last shooting line at 3:00 p.m. No shooting lines will begin after 3:00 p.m.

Note: Please come as close to 8:00 a.m. as possible.

To people who have to drive a long distance, you do not have to be there at 8:00 a.m., you are recommended to be there by **10:30 a.m.** in order to complete 3 events on time. See No Refund note on first page.

Please try to be there as soon as you can to keep the day from getting too long. Remember that there are several events to complete. This is allowed for youth who must drive 3 ½ to 4 ½ hours.

You may start competing in any of the events as soon as you are registered. There is no set order of events. It is recommended that you get into a spot that is open as soon as possible in order to complete the day's events in a reasonable time frame. Remember, no shooting lines will begin after 3:00 p.m.

NOTE: You should have enough time between events for a short break or lunch. This will be a very exciting archery event with some very interesting archery courses. **Fun for the whole family.**

National Age Requirements – Participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1 and may not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1 of the year in which they attend the National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational.

Archery Events - 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

The Dane Co. format will consist of 3 different archery courses. They are:

- Archery field target (NFAA single or 5 spot targets)
- Archery outdoor 3-D (Foam animal targets)
- Archery outdoor FITA (48" Olympic FITA targets)

- **Archery Field Target**

Junior competitors will shoot at 25 feet to 10 yards, 3 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.

Intermediate competitors will shoot at 25 feet to 15 yards, 3 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.

Senior competitors will shoot at 25 feet to 50 yards, 3 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.

- **Archery 3-D Outdoor (NO range finding devices allowed)**

Competitors will need to estimate yardage and shoot at 3-D foam animal targets.

Junior competitors will shoot at 5-15 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 20 arrows.

Intermediate competitors will shoot at 5-25 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 20 arrows.

Senior competitors will shoot at 5-40 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 20 arrows.

X-12, hart- 10, lung- 8, body-4. If you miss, a second arrow can be shot for ½ points X-6-, hart-5, lung-4, body-2
Count X's for ties.

- **Archery Outdoor FITA**

Competitors will be shooting at the famous 48" Olympic FITA Archery Targets.

A total of 40 arrows will be shot for the score. Two rounds of 4 arrows will be shot at each yardage.

Junior competitors will shoot at 10, 20, 30, and 40 yards.

Intermediates competitors will shoot at 20, 30, 40, and 50 yards.

Senior competitors will shoot at 30, 40, 50, and 60 yards.

NOTE: The large Olympic FITA Targets compensate for the long distance.

To be eligible for the Trifecta awards, you must be signed up for all 3 archery events under one of the three disciplines: Barebow, Limited, Unlimited or Bowhunter.

Note: Intermediate Archers must compete as Seniors at the Senior distances to qualify their archery scores for 4-H Nationals. They can compete as Intermediates in all other events not wanting to be qualifying scores for Nationals.

The following 2 events will be held just prior to the awards ceremony, and should be exciting and intense for everyone!

Outdoor FITA Olympic Style Eliminator Round

- To qualify you must place in the top 4 scores in your age group on the outdoor FITA round.
- 4 Juniors at 30 yards, 4 Intermediates at 40 yards, 4 Seniors at 50 yards, will compete in a shoot-out.
- 2 competitors per Olympic FITA target shooting 3 arrows per round.
- High score will continue to the next round until the field is eliminated to 1 shooter.
- 1 winner, 1 grand trophy!

3-D Olympic Style Eliminator Round

- To qualify you must place in the top 4 scores in your age group on the 3-D round.
- 4 Juniors, 4 Intermediates, and 4 Seniors will compete in a shoot-out.
- 2 competitors per 3-D target shooting 2 arrows per round.
- High score will continue to the next round until the field is eliminated to 1 shooter.
- 1 winner, 1 grand trophy!

Genesis Team Shoot

Teams can consist of either adult/youth or youth/youth. Register on site only. Equipment will be provided for this event. Competitors will be shooting at the 48" Olympic FITA targets at 15 yards. Youth may enter once in adult/youth and once in youth/youth.

Equipment Classification

Archery Barebow

Competitors will shoot long bows, recurves or compound bows without the aid of mechanical releases or sighting devices. (Sight brackets must be removed from bow, no peep or other string sights may be used. May use glove or tab. Must be shot using fingers.)

Archery Limited

Competitors will shoot recurves, or compound bows. Will allow the use of fixed sights, string peep, no sliding sights, finger shooters only, 12" or shorter stabilizer, and no magnified sights.

Archery Unlimited

Competitors will shoot long bows, recurves, or compound bows. All accessories acceptable.

Archery Bowhunter

Competitors will shoot long bows, recurves, or compound bows. Will allow the use of fixed sights, string peep, mechanical releases, any type of stabilizers, and no magnified sights.

Arrows

Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.

Statewide Invitational Shoot -Archery Tournament RULES

1. Arm guards are recommended as a safety measure, but not required.
2. Designated scoring personnel will do all the scoring. Any arrow or target touched before scoring will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero.
3. Bounce-outs or pass through will be scored only if the designated scorer can unquestionably determine the point of impact; otherwise, these will be re-shot at the end of the round.
4. Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must touch the scoring ring to score the higher value. The range commander will immediately determine any questionable call. The decision is final.
5. Archers are given the option to re-add their total scores with the scorekeeper when finished shooting.
6. Time limit is 4 minutes per end (5 arrows).
7. N.F.A.A. single spot or 5 spot target will be used for the indoor event. Shooters must choose single or 5 spot target face at the indoor event check-in station. No changes allowed thereafter.
8. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested on the original registration form and approved by the archery range commander.
9. Any rule infraction(s) may disqualify a participant at any time during the tournament as determined by the range commander or tournament committee chairperson.
- 10. All competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship with other competitors at all times.**
11. **National Age Requirements** – Participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1 and may not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1 of the year in which they attend the National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational.

Qualifications include being capable of competing in a safe manner without any assistance from parents, coaches, or other adults, and meeting any age restrictions for a given event.

Directions to Poynette Bowhunter's Club:

From I-90-94 at the Lodi exit (Hwy 60) go east through Arlington to Hwy 22. Turn left on to Hwy 22 going North. Go about 6 miles on Hwy 22, Poynette Bowhunter's Club is on the left.

From Columbus take Hwy 60 west 18 miles toward Arlington. When you get to stop sign turn right on Hwy 22 heading North about 6 miles Poynette Bowhunter's Club is on the left.
