FIRST IMPRESSIONS

AS YOU APPROACH THE COMMUNITY...*.*

I. What was my perception before visiting? What did I expect?

I knew that it was on the Mississippi and I love river towns. I really didn't know what to expect. I have seen other river towns and was very impressed - most of these were larger.

I expected a typical small river town such as Nelson, Alma, Fountain City; old buildings, most activities tied to the Mississippi River in some way. Years ago I spent some time in those towns during duck hunting season.

Never been to area before. Only knew it was on the Mississippi River. I envisioned it to be a "tourist town.

A small town built along the river - bluffs and hills. Centered around the river.

Old town on river.

II. The "five minute" impression:

Very neat houses. Very small business area.

I saw many "newer" homes on the north side. The main streets had mostly old buildings; some had been renovated while some were vacant. One old building appeared to be in the process of renovation. There did not appear to be many people on the move about town.

It looked quite quiet -- not much going on.

Why would I stop here! I can't see anything of interest except old buildings to look at.

Houses were well kept and had nice lawns.

III. Driving...evaluate EACH entrance.

Hwy 35 from Centerville -- nice housing - nice appearance.

Came in on 35N. Homes looked neat and well cared for.

Hwy K junk cars - A good fence has been erected, but it is still not good in the center of town.

Sort of a "strip" with businesses and homes from Highway 93 to town.

To Galesville - junkyard is distracting.

Drove out K a few miles. Had junk yard beside it but had covered it up as well as you can cover up junk.

Junkyard with a fence was a good idea.

Hwy 35 from south - Looks good

Nice entrance with nice homes and pretty church.

Nice parking lot. The bike trail is very eye catching all over town.

Went a few miles on 35\$, Bike trail followed for a ways.

Hwy 35 from east - Leads to the center of town; the main road to town from the east. Nothing "eye catching".

35 North - newer homes; golf course under construction attractive "new" Lutheran Church. Homes and yards well kept.

General impression - nothing special about any road leading to town.

IV. (a) Driving...evaluate the downtown business area:

Hotel signs very appealing as are the motel signs as one drives south into town on 35. "Old" buildings dominate business district with bank standing "out" as being too modern.

Appropriate signs; old buildings; shortage of some basic services such as no grocery store, one gas station, one mechanic for auto repairs. One modern, full-service bank plus one part-time branch of the Galesville Bank in Country Corner General Store.

Very small. Surprised at the small amount of businesses. People were friendly. The streets could be swept.

Not much business - lots of old buildings - most needed help.

Good but too many closed businesses.

IV. (b) Driving...evaluate other business area.

It was strange that businesses went up hill away from the river rather than be along the river front. I suppose the railroad has something to do with that. The industrial area is appropriately away from downtown and river.

Relatively new marina with about 90 boat slips. Employee indicated about 75% full in summer with plenty of room for transient boat traffic. Supper Club (Sullivan's) with good reputation on river.

No other business area. The marina was very impressive for such a small town.

Business area was sparse -- beauty shop -- a couple of restaurants. No grocery store, only a convenience-type place, gas station, a couple of bars. Why not label old buildings as to when built, used by who. There must be history in some of those buildings.

Older but nicely kept up.

V. Driving...comments on residential:

It was the usual old houses that need fixing, but generally neat, well-kept homes. Some new buildings among the old, which is a positive attitude. I noticed lots of wood piles by homes. It must be common to heat with wood.

Homes generally well-kept and neat. Newer homes north of city away from river. Modest, ranch-style homes.

Neat houses. We saw very few trashy houses. The one house, near the school parking lot (across from Methodist Church) was bad.

The residential area on the whole looked like the people that lived there cared. Most were mowed and painted, but lots of wood piles.

Well kept homes and yards.

VI. Driving... comments on:

a. street signs

It was very easy to find everything! Streets were well marked as are churches, schools, marina.

Did not observe. Assumed they were there.

They were good.

Main highway signs were well defined.

Good

b. traffic patterns/street conditions

Thought street cleaner should have cleaned up streets by now. Noticed new curbing. I'm sure erosion could be a problem with all the hills.

Streets in typical Wisconsin condition. No observable traffic patterns. Probably there are traffic patterns in summer tourist season.

Side streets could use repair.

Main streets were ok. Side streets needed repair.

Town kept very nice and clean.

c. Welcome signs (at entrances)

Thought they were ok but outdated design and construction.

Did not observe, except for Perrot State Park.

Very Good.

Older signs but did inform you as to what organizations were in town.

Well marked.

d. Direction signs to parks, schools, hospitals/clinics, attractions, services (i.e. police), etc.

Perhaps need more signs directing to all the parks but map is very helpful!

School signs observed and signs for public boat landing and marina. Also signs to Lock #6 on river.

These were done the best of all.

Good

VII. Driving...comments on industrial park/area:
Sign well defined,,busy,,growing,,new,,etc.

Clean, new buildings, busy

Did not observe

The two industries that we saw were very neat and were in one area.

No signs to the different businesses but easy to locate.

VIII. Driving...comments on schools:

Not impressed with appearance of school. No grass at entrance (some after we went by). Did not like parking in front of building.

Signs for schools. Outside appearance looked like the K-8 school buildings were a series of additions and likely an old high school. My impression was that the buildings and grounds could use some maintenance and general upkeep.

Good playground area. The tennis courts need upgrading. We thought that the school entrance needed a little beautification.

The school was located in an area that was congested. Hard to find the door one was expected to enter parking all over. Looked like it had grown and grown and grown, taking over the parking, playground, etc. Only little grass and few dandelions.

Playground next to school was good.

School seemed like an unorganized building system of additions. Entrance to front was not appealing. Did not like parking all along front. Needs grass and landscaping.

IX. Driving...comments on Parks, play grounds, athletic facilities, etc.:

Great parks! Nicely located. Rec park looks very useable with kitchen facilities, bathrooms and the sportsman's facility.

No impression worth stating regarding playground, etc. Does have large outdoor pool. Noted the end of a bicycle trail that enables a person to bike all the way to Elroy--about 100 miles. Biking only on designated trails.

Parks were numerous and well-kept. Good swimming pool. The covered picnic area and adjoining food facilities at the athletic field were very nice.

Seem to have lots of parks. One in the middle of town. Pool was built right by one of the wood industries and smelled -- maybe they donated the land?

Playground next to school was good.

X. Driving...comments on other:

a. hospitals/clinics

None

None - nearest clinic in Galesville; hospital in Lacrosse.

b. billboards/advertising

Not observed

Was none that I noticed.

XI. Walking around...comments on businesses (physical part):
Appearance, displays, signs, etc.

Having things on a hill/slant make one appreciate having a flat town. Uneven concrete gives a messy appearance.

Although most buildings were old, the interiors were modern in most businesses I entered.

They are old buildings. Some are being restored.

Old for the most. Did have a nice municipal building that housed police--city hall--community room--library, etc. That makes sense, to have them all together.

XII. Walking around...comments on people:

People were very friendly at all places we stopped!

The people I talked to were very friendly and informative. It was impossible to disguise the fact we were from Chetek. Like most people in small towns, they were anxious to talk about how good it was to live there. They were proud of their small town and some of its strengths.

People were very friendly and helpful.

People were great. Before we left, a man ran up to tell us a boat was going through the locks and thought we would like to see it. We did too.

Everybody was very friendly. The answering of our questions was good.

XVII. Community information: comments on.....

a. community brochure (tourist type)

Town map is excellent! The narratives are very informational giving some history, etc.

Colorful and informative. **As** far as I could evaluate, it covered everything the town had to offer.

Excellent brochure. Colorful painting on cover.

Done up well--Good map of the town.

Only one park

b. businesses/attractions brochures or directory

Not too many bars. Surprised there were no "retail" shops.

In addition to all the Indianhead Country brochures (from Chetek) there were separate brochures on Trempeleau County, The Great River Bike Trail, and the Long Lake Canoe Trail.

Had lots available throughout town.

- c. community profile (demographic, industrial type information for prospective business people, etc.)

Did not observe.

- d. map

excellent

yes, city, county and state

They have a very good city map.

In pamphlet and well done.

- e. other (ie. bulletin/notice tourism, kiosks, etc.)

Bulletins posted on annual Catfish Days sponsored by Lions Club, July 7-9, 1995.

XIV. City Hall...describe your visit:

- a. appearance of facility, including signing

Sterile looking. Clerk gone. Treasurer very busy on phone so not able to talk too much, but was very nice when she could. Everyone else gone.

Large sign - Municipal Building which housed: Police Dept, Library, Village Clerk and Treasurer, Fire Dept., EMT Ambulance, and Street Dept.

Wasn't the most attractive architecturaly, but was functional.

Nice kept building

- b. helpfulness of staff

Clerk was on vacation. Treasurerer and Police Chief were very helpful; answered all questions, volunteered information and gave us a tour of the building (except for library which was open on Mon-Thur (4-7:30) and Fri, (1-7); a total of 20 hours.

Busy but friendly and nice appearing.

Chief police very nice, explanation of the town was very good.

Xv. Chamber of Commerce...describe Your visit

- a. did people know where it was (or who to refer you to?)

Yes, man at hotel told us who to talk to at the Cafe, but when we got there, it was closed.

The president owned a local cafe. I believe the meetings were held there. I did not talk to her.

We were referred to a Chamber member who ran a restaurant. By the time we arrived, they were closed.

Bad odor by the swimming pool.

Good, fresh Wisconsin air with no pollution.

A combination of the river and wood products from the kiln.

Mostly clean air till you got very close to some wood industries.

Nice smell.

3. What **SOUNDS** did you hear?

Train passes through often.

Sounds of the river, boats, one large barge. Pretty quiet.

It is a quiet town -- only train noises.

~~Lots~~ of train whistles

Trains going through town.

4. What did the community feel like (emotional response, ie. cold/warm, crowded/deserted, inviting, etc., or physical response, i.e. rough streets, etc.)

Not having any "quaint" stores, there would be reason to stop if passing through, either by boat, bike or car. No bed & breakfast or resorts, just motels -- although they did look nice!

It felt like a small town that basically "closes down" in the winter and was starting to anticipate another busy summer tourist season.

The town was very quiet.

People were lovely. Never talked to one that wasn't fun and friendly and helpful.

Warm.

Deserted mostly because off season.

Seems like the state park, trail and locks could be more useful in bringing in tourists. Also, as an "**artsy-craftsy**" person, there is nothing at all for a person like me to see. What is there for someone to do or a reason to come to town?
