In 2007, there were more farmers age 65 and older in Dane County than farmers under the age of 45.

Almost one in four farmers in the county was 65 or older. That compares to 16.6 percent under 45.

Only 3.2 percent of farmers in the county were less than 35 years old. The average age of farmers in Dane County was 56.1, slightly lower than the state average of 57.1.

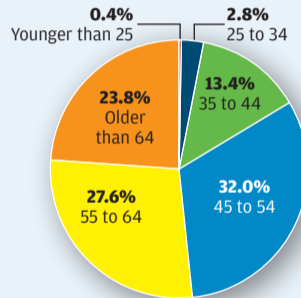
