SUP-7.1 Voluntary Pollution Assessment Programs

National Farmstead Assessment System/Home Assessment System (Farm*A*Syst/Home*A*Syst)

These non-regulatory programs concentrate on the numerous surfacewater, groundwater, and indoor air quality risks in rural America. They address the problems created on farms, ranches, other rural businesses, and rural homes by harmful nitrates, microorganisms, and toxic chemicals. Both programs are based on coordinated, practical efforts that help identify groundwater pollution risks and motivate voluntary actions to prevent pollution.

A series of pollution worksheets are used to identify pollution risks from a wide range of rural business and home site management practices. Fact sheets and technical referrals help direct voluntary prevention efforts in the common high risk areas of petroleum handling and storage, pesticide handling and storage, household wastewater disposal, and well design and management.

Program agents are located throughout the U.S. and Canada. Its national home office is located at the University of Wisconsin. Assessment packet materials are also available in Spanish.
