

# DOR: Total employment will rebound by 2012

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**A**ccording to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, nine of 11 industry sectors in Wisconsin were posting year-over-year job losses through May.

The DOR's Quarterly Economic Outlook forecasts continued losses in these sectors through the end of the year.

Only two sectors, Education and Health Services (2.5 percent) and Government (1.2 percent) show projected gains for 2009.

A slow recovery is expected to begin in 2010. However, continued job losses are forecast in six sectors through 2010.

By 2011, the DOR expects employ-

ment to increase slightly in every major sector except Natural Resources and Mining, and it forecasts that total employment will return to pre-recessionary levels by late 2012.

Despite the recovery, employment in some sectors will remain well below pre-recession levels through 2012.
