Requirements for all new jobs created between 2004 and 2014 in south-central Wisconsin*:

Education or training path**	Percentage
Short-term on-the-job training	29%
Bachelor's degree	24%
Moderate-term on-the-job training	14%
Long-term on-the-job training	8%
Postsecondary vocational training	6%
Associate degree	5%
Experience in a related occupation	5%
Bachelor's or higher, work experience	4%
Master's degree	3%
Doctoral degree	2%
First professional degree	2%
