- Why do you need a nutrient management plan (NMP)?
- Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium Management (Bring in your current soil test reports)
- How to develop and implement a NMP. (Brief demonstration on Snap Plus)
- Agricultural Siting Law, Emergency Response Plans, Federal and Local Farm Programs (Environmental Quality Incentive Programs-EQIP, and local county ordinances)

## January 10, 2008

**Nutrient Management Refresher Course**  
**11:00am to 3:00pm**

This workshop is for landowners who are actively implementing a nutrient management plan.

Farmers who attend this workshop will be taught why a NMP is a good farm asset to have and other implementation strategies.

- What Lies Beneath Our Feet (taking a look at soil profiles)
- Insurances and Liabilities
- Mapping and documenting where tile lines are and the outlets, surface water and groundwater protection, well abandonment, and other sights to be watchful for.
- Agricultural Siting Law, Emergency Response Plans, Federal and Local Farm Programs (Environmental Quality Incentive Programs-EQIP, and local county ordinances)
