ABOUT

Carolina Clear is a Clemson University Public Service Activities program that delivers comprehensive, targeted, regional stormwater education and involvement programming guided by the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Service (MS4) permit. The program works with Extension Agents to deliver appropriate programming to diverse target audiences and seeks to measure behavior change through strategic education and involvement programming.

JOB DESCRIPTION

This position will provide water quality protection, water resource conservation and watershed management outreach programming primarily in the Midlands region of South Carolina including Lexington County. Oversight and coordination of specific goals and regional Carolina Clear activities will also be provided.

The position is a unique opportunity to provide outreach programming via Extension in natural resource topics with a focus on watershed management, water quality protection, and stormwater awareness and management.

The position is located in Lexington, SC. Position is full time, 37.5 hours per week. Salary range is \$33,000 to \$37,500, commensurate with experience.

REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor's degree in natural resource management, hydrology, environmental science or planning field at a minimum; Master's degree in one of the mentioned fields preferred. The successful candidate will have knowledge of watershed-related issues as well as experience coordinating groups and relating information to different audiences. Ability to work constructively with teachers, youth, public agencies, the private sector, government and the general public. Experience in extension programming is also preferred. Working knowledge of relevant federal and state environmental policy. Ability to lead and work amongst a team. Excellent oral and written communication skills, including computer fluency (word processing, spreadsheet, and presentation applications).
