PLEASE NOTE

Brown Swiss, Jersey and any other breeds that do not have individually distinctive markings must be freeze branded, tattooed or ear tagged for identification. If you identify your animals with a freeze brand, tattoo or metal or plastic ear tag, that ID number must be recorded on the form.

When you check your dairy cattle exhibits in at the county fair, you will be required to present permanent identification to verify that animals being exhibited were listed on this form and to meet Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection requirements for identification of animals exhibited at the fair. Permanent identification may be: (a) registration papers, (b) a sketch or photo of a spotted animal, with birth date, dam and sire identification (form similar to old ID sheet), (c) freeze brand, (d) tattoo, or (e) ear tag.

Read and comply with *Wisconsin County, District, & State Fairs Animal Health Rules and Regulations* and *Jr. Dairy Cattle Department Requirements* which are found in the *Oconto County Fair Premium List*.
