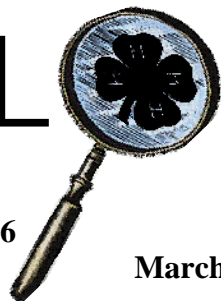

Dear 4-H Family:

Parents can help their children succeed in 4-H. Here are some Do's and Don'ts of being a 4-H parent.

- **DO** take time to learn about 4-H, what it stands for, and how it operates.
- **DO** show your interest and enthusiasm for the 4-H projects selected. Find out what is suggested for members to do and learn. Encourage your child to work on the project and record keeping all year long and not wait until the last minute.
- **DO** encourage your child to participate in county events.
- **DO** keep in mind that the most important goal of 4-H is personal growth of the individual.
- **DO** give encouragement when your 4-H'er succeeds and even more when he/she fails. Judging and awards are not final exams. Whatever ratings are given or scores received, help your child to see progress made, things that have been learned, and goals that have been reached.
- **DO ASK QUESTIONS!**
- **DON'T** do your child's project for them, even though you may be able to do it faster, better, simpler, and with much less mess.
- **DON'T** discourage a child's enthusiasm by providing too much corrective influence or criticism.
- **DON'T** let the desire to win overpower your child's ability to learn. Do keep in mind that the 4-H experience should be an educational one.

Ask yourself why you wanted your child to join 4-H. If it is to win, you will be disappointed. If it is so your child can learn and become involved in a worthwhile activity, you will be satisfied. Recognition comes with doing the best your child can do. Be a supportive parent and help your child and 4-H leader to "Make the Best Better!"

### Wisconsin State Fair Announces New Classes and Rule Updates for the 2008 Junior Swine Shows

Two new programs are being implemented in the Junior Performance Barrow class and the Junior Bred and Owned Barrow Class. The Junior Performance Barrow class is open to all junior exhibitors. Final placing will be a combination of performance 70% (lean gain) and live judging 30%. Barrows must weigh 60 lbs and under at initial check-ins on April 19<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup>. Lean gain will be calculated using starting weight and scan data collected at the Fair. \$2,000 in prize money will be awarded to the top entries. The Junior Bred and Owned Barrow Class is open to purebred barrows only. To be eligible to show in this class, the dam of the barrow must have been recorded in the exhibitor's name at the time of breeding. Bred and Owned barrows will show in a separate class and compete for over \$600 in prizes and awards. Barrows will be identified by DNA and will be issued an official Wisconsin State Fair ear tag at regional check-in sites on April 19<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup>. New for 2008, there are no maximum weight requirements for the junior show barrows as part of the identification process. Only exhibitors who wish to show barrows in the performance class need to weigh their. Also new for 2008, no ultra-sound scanning, lean gain calculations or a carcass contest. The junior barrow shows will remain terminal. In addition, all Crossbred breeding gilts will show by weight.

### Fair Board Policy Updates:

- \* "Any youth exhibiting in the Junior Division at the Barron County Fair shall not be allowed to exhibit in the Junior Division at any other County Fair held before or after date of such fair in the same calendar year. If they choose to do so, they will forfeit all premiums and/or proceeds gained from the Barron County Fair. Showing at the Barron County Fair is a privilege; therefore, at any time or for any reason, and by majority vote, the board shall have the right to remove any exhibit or exhibitor."
- \* Any animal participating in the Barron County Fair must stay at the fair. Youth must prove ownership or management agreement with each entry. If an animal is vetted out for any reason, it shall not be eligible to show at the fair.
- \* No pets of any kind are permitted on the fairgrounds at any time. This includes, dogs, cats, ferrets, pocket pets, snakes, etc., on a leash or in a carrier or held in a person's arms. The exception would be service animals or those animals involved in acts or shows. Animals shall not be left in unattended vehicles or campers under **any** circumstances. This is for the safety of fair attendees and the animals themselves.
