YOUTH VOICES ON THE SUPERIOR CITY COUNCIL

The Superior City Council is now accepting applications for three youth to serve as Youth Representatives on the City Council. Youth must currently be in grades 9 or 10 this school year. Selected students will serve a two-year term of office.

Student representatives will represent the youth of the city on the City Council. This initiative provides youth an opportunity to play a valuable and active leadership role in the governance of the city, while developing their own interests in how local government works.

Youth Representatives also have an opportunity to share the youth perspective on current issues as well as becoming engaged citizens of Superior.

TERMS OF OFFICE

Youth Representatives serve two year terms of office. The first year you will serve as an alternate, and the second year you will serve as a main Youth Representative. Youth applying this year will serve from September 2009 to June of 2011.



RESPONSIBILITIES

Youth involvement on the Superior City Council will require not only enthusiasm, but a commitment of your time and energy to this important role. If selected, you will be required to attend bi-weekly Council meetings and possibly other committee meetings. You might be asked to become actively involved in exploring an issue and following through on whatever action is taken about the issue.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Applications and three reference forms are due by June 1, 2009.
- Please mail the application to the address listed on the application.
- One reference form should be from a parent/guardian and the other two from someone at your school or in the community.
- Interviews and/or selection of candidates will be made by June 15, 2009.
- Orientation and training will be held at the courthouse in August.
- Terms will begin at the first September City Council meeting.
