DEPARTMENT 108 - RABBITS
ATCP NO. 160.18

REGULATIONS:

1. Exhibitor must be present when rabbits are judged.
2. Exhibitor may not show more than three breeds, one entry per lot.
3. Animals must be brought to the fair in humane, well-ventilated cages.
4. All rabbits must be in place by 10:30 a.m. on entry day.
5. The Department Superintendent will inspect animals as they are entered. Any animal showing signs of illness or infection will be sent home.
6. Only rabbits being exhibited will be allowed in the building.
7. Each exhibitor must clean, feed and water their animals daily, keeping barn clean.
7. Pen rental is .25¢ per rabbit.

This certificate must be issued by an accredited veterinarian. No animals will be permitted to unload without the tag certificate and checked in by superintendent.
2. Animals eligible to show in any other department will not be allowed to exhibit here.
3. Exhibitors may not enter more than one animal in each lot.

2. Any pygmy with warts, abscesses, mange, ringworm, or any other contagious disease is prohibited from showing. Any animal found to be infected will be immediately removed from the premises.
