Regulations:

1. Plants should be houseplant suitable only for indoors. (See Class E & F for other entries)
2. Beginner - 1st & 2nd year in project; Intermediate 3rd & 4th year in project; Advanced 5th or higher year in project.
3. Plants exhibited must be started, grown and cared for by the exhibitor.
4. Attach a card with the following information: growth factor, characteristics of plant and date started.
5. Use a straw or skewer in the planter to attach entry tag and card.
6. Exhibitors are responsible for watering plants during the fair.

CLASS E —FLOWER BARRELS

1. Flower Barrels will be furnished by the Fair Board.
2. All planters must be placed across from the Youth and HCE building for judging.
3. Judging is face-to-face at 11:00 on Thursday. A representative from a group entry should be present. Any individual exhibitor should be present. If not available for judging, attach a card describing the design of your planter.
4. Entry tag and check in is required.
5. Entries may be by a youth club, group or organization, or by an individual.
6. Group entries require separate entry and tags.
7. The Fair Board will award additional cash prizes to the top three barrels in the amount of \$20, \$10, & \$5.
