Livestock Total Performance Award Jr. Fair

This award will be presented to the exhibitor whose animal best performs in all phases of livestock competition at the Jackson County Fair. Recognition will be based upon live showing, placing, ranking in the carcass show and ranking in the average daily gain competition. Evaluation procedures to determine the total performance award for each species of livestock will be based upon the lowest combination for ranking scores from the three areas of competition. Live randing will designate Grand and Reserve Champion as first and second respectively followed by the class standing positions, blue group through pink group. Carcass and Rate of Gain are determined by numerical placings.

Virgin-Stock & Lite Farm Classes

• 5500 • 6500

Semi-Stock Classes – 1957 or Older

• 4000 • 5000 • 6000 • 7000

Open Classes - 1959 or Older

•4500 • 5500 • 6500

Heavy Farm Classes

• 8500 • 10500 Non -Turbo • 13,500

1. Any one caught tampering with a tractor other than their own will be disqualified.
2. Engine speed must be controlled by throttle lever only. NO strings or wires allowed.
3. Anyone using profanity toward track officials will be disqualified and forfeit next pull.
4. Maximum draw bar height is 20 " at point of hook. Minimum of 18" from a center near a rear axle to hoot points. Must have rigid draw bar. Fast hitches must be locked.
5. Where weights or parts fall is the measurement of the pull.
6. Anyone refusing to weigh a tractor before pulling or refusing to re-weigh after pulling will be disqualified.
7. No locked or welded rear ends.
8. Each tractor is limited to one driver per class and two hooks per tractor. Semi-stock can no hook in Open, Virgin or Farm classes. No Open tractors in Semi-Stock, Virgin, or Farm Classes.
9. No re-pulls for first driver in each class. Registration Position is Pull Position.
10. A driver can stop to adjust weight with in the first 50 feet if they restart under their own power.
11. There will be a driver's meeting before each pull.
12. All tractors will be inspected and weighed-in to meet the above rules.
13. RPM's over 10% will be checked, if over, you're disqualified.
14. No racing fuels in Virgin Stock, if you need racing full, you belong in open class.
15. Track official's decisions are FINAL!!

Virgin-Stock and Lite Farm Classes, 5500 and 6500.

Must have Stock-Block, Head, Ignition, Stock-Wheels, 10% over on RPM, Working Governor, Factory Wheel Weights, No suite case weights or brackets. Pull in 1st or 2nd gear only. Maximum 4 MPH. No press steel wheels, unless OEM. No cut tires, tire size limit 16.9 x 38. NO 4010's or 4020's or like tractors in Virgin-Stock or Lite Farm Classes.

Semi-Stock Classes, 4000, 5000, 6000, 7000 — 1957 or Older

10% Over on RPM, Working Governor, 4 to 5 MPH, No electric fuel pumps, No turbos. No alcohol, tire size limit for 4000 is 15.5 x 38. 5000 on up - 16.9 x 38. NO M Farmals or 88 Olivers in 4000 class.

Open Classes: 4500, 5500, 6500 — 1959 or older

Allowed: Down Draft Carbs, MSD, Cut tires. Must have safety equipment such as kill switch, wheely bars, and flywheel protection. If not equipped RPM limited to 30% over. No tire size limit.

Heavy Farm Classes: 8500,10500, 12500
