

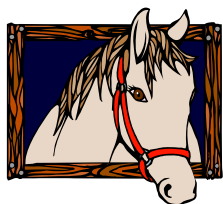
Kenosha County 4-H Horse Project

"Horse Barn Information"

1. To stay in the barn is a privilege and not to be abused. Those not following rules may be sent home and barn privileges suspended for one year.
2. Each exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up his or her assigned stall as specified by the Superintendent..
3. Feeding of horses is each exhibitor's responsibility. If other arrangements are needed, be sure they are made ahead of time and make sure the barn superintendent is aware of this. Feeding time will be between 7:00 and 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
4. Only Horse project members will be eligible to spend nights at the fair. This will be done only with preapproval from the Barn Superintendent.
5. No sitting on stall walls or swinging on gates in a barn.
6. No sitting on horse in stalls.
7. No riding into or out of barns. When taking your horse in or out of the barn during open hours of fair, you must be accompanied by a person in front and in the back of your horse. Do not mount your horse in main pedestrian traffic. It is suggested that you lead your horse to and from the arena.
8. We will attempt to have at least two responsible adults to supervise barns at all times. Each exhibitor staying in barn is expected to fill slots. **This is a family commitment.**
9. No smoking or alcoholic beverages in barns.
10. No grooming in aisles.
11. Horses are allowed only in designated areas. This consists of the horse barns, arena and wash racks.
12. Horses cannot be ridden, driven, or schooled by any one other than the exhibitor with the exception of the Alumni Class.
13. The arena may be used for practice during daylight hours. An adult must be present during all practices. Anyone riding must use a bridle - no riding with just a halter.
14. Boots will be worn by exhibitor at all times, when grooming or cleaning stalls and while riding.
15. Each year, additional requirements may be posted by the current barn superintendent. It is the exhibitors responsibility to be sure these are followed.
16. Every horse ID'd and housed out at the Kenosha County Fairgrounds needs to have a horse/rider combination during either the English show or the Western show. If no horse/rider combination is utilized, you will lose all barn privileges the following year.
17. Any person housing their horse at the Kenosha County Fairgrounds **MUST** perform barn duties as stated by the barn superintendent. If barn duties are not performed, you will lose barn privileges the following year.

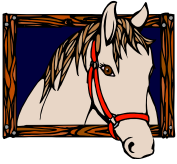
"Barn Make Up"

1. Barn decorations may be hung, but must be high enough so as not to interfere with the horses and must be fastened. Keep in mind there is usually a planned outline. If you have ideas or suggestions, check with the barn superintendent.
2. It is suggested that all hay and grain not being fed, be kept in trailers or in containers and neatly stacked behind your horses stall.
3. It is suggested that all tack be kept away from barn area to prevent loss, theft, or mix up.
4. All grain and water buckets, brushes and other items should be clearly marked with exhibitors name to prevent mix up.
5. Anyone staying overnight must get a permit card from the barn superintendent. It will have to be signed by your parent. This form must be turned in to the barn superintendent by 4:00 each day so he/she can sign it and turn it into the Fair Police for approval and signature. If not received by this time, you will not be allowed to stay in the barn that night. **ANYONE STAYING IN THE BARN OVERNIGHT MUST BE IN THE BARN BY 11 PM.** Staying in the barn overnight is subject to having enough parent volunteers.
6. S.E.I. Helmets and boots to be worn whenever mounted.
7. Every family or exhibitor is only allowed one (1) trailer to be parked at the north end of the horse barn. Extra trailer parking is allowed in designated area. Trailer parking is on a first come basis when your horse is dropped off.



"Barn Use"

1. Horses being housed at the fair must be in place no earlier than 2 p.m. on Tuesday and no later than noon on Wednesday. There will be no exceptions to this rule and it will be enforced.
2. Written veterinarian proof of tetanus and East & West sleeping sickness and original negative Coggins dated within calendar year of the fair and of Flu and Rhino immunization dated at least two weeks prior to the opening of fair and within six months. This paperwork must be turned in to the barn superintendent before your horse is unloaded from the trailer and will be held until your horse is released on Sunday evening. Horses can be checked at any time during the duration of fair.
3. Any out of state horse requires a valid 30-day health certificate.
4. Horses housed in the barns will be released on Sunday according to the Fair Book.
5. Sick horses will only be allowed to leave Fair by direction of veterinarian or barn supervisor.
