Camp Information

A qualified person is on duty at all times to handle health and accident problems. The Crivitz Rescue Squad is ready to handle any emergencies. Campers are covered by accident insurance. Parents should keep in mind that all activities in life pose some risk. Primary insurance coverage is always the responsibility of the parent.

Camp Bird consists of five cabins in each of its four units. Nine campers and one counselor live in each cabin. A large dining hall with a modern kitchen is at the center of the grounds. All campers are served plentiful, nutritious meals. A large recreation hall, craft shop, and nature building are available for inclement weather. Convenient shower and bathroom facilities are provided, too.

Camp Staff

The camp staff consists of six full-time paid adults. There are also counselors, dishwashers, and adult volunteers from each county. There is also a qualified health director on duty at all times to handle health and accident problems.

Refund Policy

A complete refund, except for \$20, will be made to you if you cancel within fourteen days prior to the first day of camp. No refund is given after this time except for prorated refunds in case of major illness, accident, or a death in the family.
