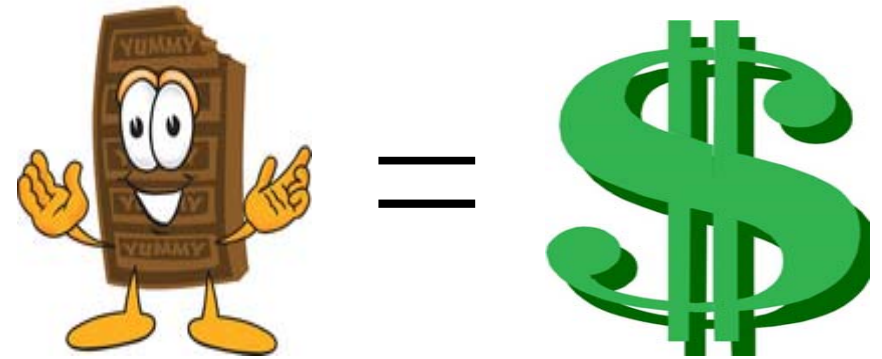
**Staff** Camp TaPaWingo Staff are the most valuable asset we have at camp. Camp Staff members are chosen from applicants not only from Manitowoc County, but all over Wisconsin and the United States. They are all either college students or working adults who are selected for their genuine love of children, maturity, certifications, and camp skills. All staff members take part in an extensive training program prior to the camp season.



**Home Away From Home** When campers arrive at Camp TaPaWingo, they will be introduced to their counselor who will take them to the rustic cabin that will be their home for the week. Campers are typically placed in a cabin with 3-6 other campers around their same age and gender. The entire camp eats all meals together in our dining hall (Rensink Lodge). Meals are nutritionally balanced. Does your child have a food allergy or vegetarian request? Our kitchen staff will accommodate his or her needs. There is also a nurse on site at all times to ensure a healthy camp!

## Registration Details

**CAMP FEE :** The balance of all sessions is due **July 1, 2009**.

**DEPOSIT:** A \$25 deposit per camper is required with the registration form. The deposit is deducted from the total camp fee.

**EXTRA EXPENSES:** Campers have Trading Post time through-out the week. Trading post items that can be purchased are 4-H items, games, t-shirts, drinks, and candy.

**CAMPERSHIPS:** Camp TaPaWingo offers a program for families who need financial assistance to attend camp. Contact camp for more information.

**PRICING PROGRAM:** Our camp fee's are a historically subsidized rate, and do not reflect the true cost of operating. United Way provides funding for our Summer Camp program, which helps defray the cost of camp.

**Activity Periods** are scheduled times throughout the day when campers participate in various activities related to Arts and Crafts, Recreation, or Nature. Some examples of what the campers may do during these times are tie-dying, fishing, archery, air rifle, swimming, basketball, or making crafts.

**Flex-Time** activities occur 2-3 times per week and allow the campers to choose whatever supervised activity they want to do that day. Traditional activities include cray fishing, frog catching, biking, bracelet making, slip-n-slide, fishing and many more.

**Cabin Time** includes games, meals, and down time for cabin groups to spend together. Campers are often surprised at the strong friendships they form so quickly within their cabin group!

**All Camp Activities** occur in the evening. Campers enjoy skits, counselor shows, campfires, songs, and night activities. Friday evening concludes with the closing dinner and ceremony which all parents are encouraged to attend.
