

2008 4-H AMBASSADOR EXPECTATIONS

1. **COOPERATE:** Being a Marathon County 4-H Ambassador is both a privilege and an honor. The purpose of the Ambassador program is to promote and represent the 4-H name. Ambassadors are a role model for the Marathon County 4-H program. Throughout your term, you are expected to follow the 4-H code of conduct and show a positive, enthusiastic attitude to **ALL** (advisors, fellow Ambassadors, volunteers, other 4-Her's, etc.)
2. **BE ACCOUNTABLE, PARTICIPATE:** As an Ambassador, you are expected to attend all meetings/events. If you **CANNOT** make a scheduled event you are expected to contact Amber Brei. The greatest expectation is that you are **accountable**. If you miss a meeting or are unsure about the time, date of a meeting/event, it is your responsibility to get the information.
3. **BE NICE, RESPECT EACH OTHER, BE OPEN MINDED:** It is expected that each Ambassador conduct him/herself in a professional manner at meetings and events. This includes: bringing concerns before the group and/or Ambassador Advisors, respecting others' opinions, and the willingness to confront others when there is a problem. It is important that we keep an open mind and work through problems as a team. Gossip and negative talk will not be tolerated. Ambassadors are asked not to bring his/her boyfriend/girlfriend to meetings/events. Public display of affection is inappropriate at any Ambassador meeting/event.
4. **LISTEN, STAY ATTENTIVE, STAY FOCUSED:** Ambassadors are asked to bring pencil, calendar and be ready to conduct business at each meeting.
5. Ambassadors are expected to wear Ambassador attire at all events. This attire is at the discretion of the Ambassador Advisor.
