

CAMP ACTIVITIES

☆Arts and Crafts: As a camper, you will explore your creative abilities to make things from macrame, cord, cloth, clay, wood and other materials.

☆Recreation: You will have opportunities to get involved with other campers in games of softball, volleyball, basketball, ping pong, parachutes.

☆Waterfront: You will be able to refresh yourself by swimming, boating, & canoeing in lovely Sand Lake. You will also enjoy fishing.

☆Nature: You will have opportunities to explore the many natural wonders in and around camp such as: the lake, nature trails, streams, animal tracks, birds and trees.

☆Campfires: As a camper, you will be able to celebrate camp with music, skits, story telling and entertainment.

☆Activities: All areas of camp will offer a variety of activities including: songs, talent show, group games, scavenger hunts, eco-exploring, and challenging activities.

WHAT TO BRING

- ✓Pillow, warm blankets or warm sleeping bag (please put in plastic bag and put your name on the bag)
- ✓Outdoor play clothes (warm jacket)
- ✓Comfortable shoes (not new) suggest 2 pair (sandals with heel straps are allowed for a second pair)
- ✓Toilet articles (soap, towel, toothbrush, etc.)
- ✓Limit luggage to one suitcase and bedroll
- ✓(Not skimpy) swim suit and plastic bag

DO NOT BRING: cell phones, boomboxes, walkmen, discmen, game boys, pagers, clock radios, other electronic equipment, squirt guns, candy, gum, or other food. You may bring money if you wish to purchase a t-shirt (\$10). Ample food is provided at camp plus free canteen.

Traditional Summer Camp (Grades 3 to 6) will be held simultaneously with Adventure Camp (Grades 7 to 8). Youth from Outagamie County will also be camping June 16-19.

At Adventures Camp, you will enjoy fishing, eco-explorations and many other adventure activities. You will be challenged in a number of new and exciting outdoor experiences. Other activities may include: canoeing, boating, recreation, swimming, hiking, and campfires.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Campers may arrive between 11:00 and noon on Mon., June 16 and leave camp at 3 pm on June 19.

CAMP FACILITIES

Camp Bird has five cabins in each of its four units. Nine campers and one counselor live in each cabin. A large dining hall with a modern kitchen is at the center of the grounds. All campers are served plentiful, nutritious meals. A big recreation hall, craft shop and nature building are available for inclement weather. Convenient shower and bathroom facilities are provided.

A qualified person is on duty at all times to handle health and accident problems. Twin Bridge Rescue and Town of Stephenson (fire protection) are ready to handle any emergencies. Campers are covered by accident insurance.

CAMP STAFF

Full-time adult staff members plus adult volunteer leaders provide supervision during each week at camp. Also included are a camp manager and food coordination staff.

POLICY

A complete refund, except for \$10 of the deposit fee, will be made to you, if you cancel by 10 days prior to the first day of camp or in extreme cases of illness, accidents, circumstances or death in the family. Any other cancellations will result in forfeiture of 50 percent of the total camp fee.

CAMP BIRD EXPECTATIONS

- 1] No drugs, tobacco or intoxicating beverages permitted at any time at camp.
- 2] Individuals will be charged for property damage.
- 3] Hunting is not permitted; firearms and firecrackers are prohibited.
- 4] Boys are not allowed in girls cabins or vice versa.
- 5] Violation of safety rules endangering oneself or other persons will not be permitted.

NOTE: ALL OF THE ABOVE ACTIVITIES ARE CAUSE FOR BEING SENT HOME WITHOUT REFUND OF FEES.

- 6] Youth should be responsible and sufficiently mature to conduct themselves at all times in an appropriate manner. Youth are expected to respect the rights of others to hear speakers and others during the programs.
- 7] Youth are expected to participate in the scheduled activities while at camp.
- 8] Youth will abide by the behavior guidelines of Camp Bird and their county.

- 9] Youth will not leave Camp Bird without consulting the Program Director.
- 10] Youth will abide by all camp policies, including not bringing food and radios/tape players to camp.
- 11] Swimming allowed only when lifeguards are present.
- 12] Boaters must wear life jackets.
- 13] Wildlife, flowers, trees and other plants are for all to enjoy as they are - **DO NOT DISTURB THEM!!**
- 14] No inappropriate (alcohol, tobacco, etc.) or obscene t-shirts, string bikinis or skimpy clothing.
