Once again, the Marquette County Thyme Shares Master Gardeners are coordinating their annual order for fruit trees and garden fruits. This year we have available a variety of apple trees including flowering crab apple, peaches, sweet and tart cherries, pears, plums and new this year apricot. In addition we have asparagus, blueberries, raspberries, strawberries and grapes. All trees and plants are sold with no guarantee or replacement policy and should be planted as soon as possible upon receipt.

NOTICE: Although we sell over 1,000 trees, quantities of all varieties are limited and orders will be filled in the order in which they are received. Therefore, you are urged to **ORDER EARLY** to avoid being disappointed and not having your order filled. Last year some varieties were sold out within a few weeks of being offered for sale. So, the earlier we receive your order, the better your chances of it being completely filled. All fruit trees are \$13.50 and will include a fertilizer pack with each tree purchased. Also this year we will have tree guards available for sale.

Asparagus		\$8.00/25	\$	Jersey Supreme All male variety with high yield potential, harvest early, cold tolerant and best adapted to light-medium sandy soils. Good rust resistance and tolerant to fusarium with extremely vigorous large succulent spears.
Strawberries		\$5.00/25	\$	Cabot Highly recommended for home gardeners. Huge berries, excellent flavor with good winter hardiness and disease resistance. It is by far the best-tasting big berry ever. Zones 4-8.
Raspberries		\$9.00/5	\$	Killarney—Summer Bearing Especially winter hardy with high-quality fruit that has bright-red color and a good raspberry aroma and flavor.
		\$9.00/5	\$	Polana—Fall Bearing Earliest ever bearing variety. Large glossy red berries with good flavor. Ripens in early to mid-August in our area.
Blueberries <i>Not a self-fruitful plant; need two varieties for pollination</i>		\$7.50	\$	Bluecrop A variety known for its extreme hardiness, vigor and consistent production. A very upright growth. Fruit is light blue, firm and produces a large cluster. Good green color in summer and fiery red in the fall. Very hardy and drought resistant. Grows 4 to 6 feet tall.
		\$7.50	\$	Jersey A late season variety that is easy to grow, high yielding and one of the oldest and most widely grown blueberry varieties. The berries are dark blue, medium in size and very sweet. Its tall and well-shaped bush has excellent ornamental value.
Grapes		\$6.00	\$	Fredonia A blue-black concord-type grape with very large berries. Is used for both table and juice production. Very hardy, productive and vigorous.
		\$6.00	\$	Frontenac Produces a good quality red wine with a pleasant cherry aroma. It has good resistance to powdery mildew and near-immunity to downy mildew. Cold hardy to -30°F.
		\$6.00	\$	Louise Swenson One of a long line of winter hardy hybrid wine grapes developed by Elmer Swenson. Reportedly hardy to -40°F. Used to produce white wine, with a delicate aroma of honey and flowers.
		\$6.00	\$	Mars Seedless A vigorous, blue seedless grape. Clusters are medium sized and well filled. Hardiness is good and the vines are resistant to several major diseases. Plump, sweet, juicy, a true seedless.
		\$6.00	\$	Reliance Seedless Reliance is a pink, seedless grape. Berries are tender, sweet, melt-in-your-mouth good eating. Also great for jelly and juicing. Reliance has proven to be disease-resistant and hardy.
Pear Trees <i>Pears require cross pollination - use 2 varieties</i>		\$13.50	\$	Clapps Favorite (ripens Sept 1) Very large yellow pear with red cheek. Flesh juicy. Fine texture and sweet. Tree is hardy, productive, zone 4.
		\$13.50	\$	Red Bartlett Retains the original Bartlett flavor but far exceeds its sweetness. The bright red color of this pear make it very appetizing. Grows rapidly and has begun to yield crops the third year after planting. Zone 4.
Apricot Tree		\$13.50	\$	Harlayne Introduced in 1980 from Harrow Research Station, Canada. Fruit is bright yellow with a red blush. An excellent late season apricot. Self fruitful.

Apples <i>Most apples need two varieties for pollination</i> <i>* indicates disease resistant</i>		\$13.50	\$	Crimson Crisp* (ripens Sept 10) This is an exciting new disease resistant variety. The fruit is medium in size with a very attractive crimson red color over 95% of the surface. Has a very firm, crisp texture with a tart, complex flavor. The tree is very grower friendly with spreading habit, fruiting throughout the tree on 2 or 3 year old branches.
		\$13.50	\$	Crimson Gold* (ripens Sept 10) Another new disease resistant cultivar. The fruit colors nicely with a near full red-orange blush on a yellow background. The flesh is white, firm and juicy. Fruits are medium in size with a sweet-tart flavor. Storage life of up to eight months.
		\$13.50	\$	Crimson Topaz* (ripens Oct 1) A new disease resistant dessert apple. Fruit is medium size, crisp and juicy with good flavor. It has a 50% orange striping color over a yellow background. Growth habit is spur-like, vigorous and upright. A precocious cropper, that holds its fruit well.
		\$13.50	\$	Freedom* (ripens Sept 21) Very disease resistant. Controlling all apple diseases including fire flight. Fruits are large, bright red. Fine-textured, tender juicy flesh.
		\$13.50	\$	Galarina* (ripens Oct 10) Fruit resembles Gala, red to orange-red, with some yellow background color. Flavor is crisp and sweet and will store up to four months.
		\$13.50	\$	Liberty* (ripens Oct 1) Apple scab or cedar rust a problem? Liberty is your answer. Apples are deep, dark red with a blush of yellow. Very flavorful, crispy crunchy flesh.
		\$13.50	\$	Cameo (ripens Oct 10). The fruit is firm, crisp and characterized by a highly appealing sub acid, aromatic flavor. The apple color is bright red strip over creamy background.
		\$13.50	\$	Honeycrisp (ripens Sept 10) This crisp, juicy, sweet apple has a rich flavor that made it #1 in taste panels. The fruit averages 3" and up. Stores well. Tree has outstanding winter hardiness, excellent for northern growing.
		\$13.50	\$	Rogers Red McIntosh (ripens Sept 15) A good coloring McIntosh selection suitable for northern-most McIntosh growers. Good storage qualities and winter hardiness. A long time standard of Red McIntosh strains.
		\$13.50	\$	Snow Sweet (ripens Sept 25) Apple is a bronze-red blush with creamy white flesh. Texture is crisp with excellent flavor. This variety is cold-hardy and grows best in northern districts. Fruit keeps up to two months in common storage.
Crab Apples		\$13.50	\$	Chestnut True crab tree. An excellent pollinizer for early to mid season apples. Trees are slightly upright with large white blossoms. The large size fruit is used in preserves and decorations.
		\$13.50	\$	Indian Summer Abundant pink flowers with extended bloom period. Excellent pollinizer with viable pollen over an extended period for your apple tree.
		\$13.50	\$	Snow Drift* Very abundant white flowers during mid-season attract pollinating bees often used to pollinate red delicious. Trees are small and sturdy. Fruit a salmon egg sized and yellow with orange cheek— disease resistant .
Plums		\$13.50	\$	Stanley Large, prune shaped, bluish purple, very attractive fruit. Yellow flesh, juicy, sweet and richly flavored. Stanley is best choice for home and commercial use. Early bearing and hardy. Freestone and self-fruitful.
Cherries		\$13.50	\$	Black Gold (Sweet) A dark red cherry, large, and of high quality. Trees are self-fertile and do not require cross pollination. Trees are very winter hardy and productive.
		\$13.50	\$	Montmorency (Tart) This tart cherry has long been recognized as the standard of the industry and is planted throughout North America and is considered the best tart cherry for the processing market. The fruit is bright red, medium in size, with a clear juicy flesh. The trees are self-fruitful, winter hardy, and very productive.
Peaches		\$13.50	\$	Madison Hardy, vigorous and frost resistant. Fruit is freestone, medium size with bright red skin and deep yellow firm flesh. The flavor is mild and rich. Excellent for fresh use, freezing and canning. Self fruitful. Ripens late August. Extend your peach production by combining with Reliance.
		\$13.50	\$	Reliance The most cold-hardy peach. Reliance withstands below zero temperatures and also has excellent bud hardiness.
