Additional Rules of Entry:

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in a 4-H Caged Birds and Small Pets project or other youth groups carrying a similar program as their supervised project. Specify species on entry form. (Ex. Small Mammals--mouse or gerbil; Reptile--turtle)
- Any animal displaying symptoms of a contagious disease or parasites will not be allowed to show.
- All pets should be brought to the fair in a suitable cage or container for judging.
- Tropical fish should not be brought to the fair. Exhibitors should turn in a scrapbook containing a description of the project and photos. Each successive year the exhibitors will update and add to the existing scrapbook. Scrapbooks may be 8 ½ x 11 or 12 x 12 inches in size.
- The Caged Bird and Other Small Pet show will take place the Sunday before the main Fair dates beginning at 8:30 a.m. Caged birds and small pets will be brought in at the time of judging and taken home that same day.
- An overall best of show will be selected from all entries in these classes.
