## Requirements:

- Youth enrolled in a 4-H, FFA, or other youth groups in a supervised fruit and/or vegetable project are eligible to participate in this project.
- All produce exhibited must be from the current year's crop and from the exhibitor's own garden.
- Vegetable exhibitors are limited to listing no more than 10 vegetables on the fair entry form plus a vegetable box.
- Refer to UW Extension Publication A3306, [Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables](#) for guidelines on selecting, cleaning and trimming vegetables for exhibit.
- Fruits and vegetables need to be cleaned but not washed. Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified.
- Garden Boxes: Exhibits must include the number of specimens per type according to the following list:

Beans - 15	Cucumbers, slicing – 3	Peppers - 2
Beets - 3	Dry Onions - 3	Rutabaga - 1
Cabbage - 1	Eggplant – 1	Sweet Corn - 3
Carrots - 3	Kohlrabi - 1	Tomatoes - 3
Cucumbers, pickling – 6	Muskmelon – 1	Turnips – 2
- Potatoes:
  - Turn in a 3X5 inch card with the variety name with the exhibit
  - Clean potatoes with soft brush or cloth--washing is not recommended.
