

Notice To Performance Project Exhibitors 2006 Oconto County Fair

The Oconto County Fair is successful in large part due to the efforts of many volunteers. The fair board has been particularly concerned over the years in a lack of help to clean-up and put away on the Monday after the Fair.

The fair board also feels that the financial rewards generated by the Sale of Champions for those exhibitors who sell at the sale mean those exhibitors have a vested interest in seeing the Fair (including the Sale of Champions) continue to prosper.

The fair board will implement a penalty of 2% of the proceeds of a sale for sellers who do not help with set-up and clean-up.

The following are the guidelines for the 2005 County Fair.

- ❖ Exhibitors who sell exhibits at the Sale of Champions will be expected to volunteer a minimum of three hours of help to clean-up the fairgrounds on Monday, August 22. The work may or may not be in the barn the exhibitor showed in and this expectation is in addition to time that may be required of all exhibitors by superintendents in any of the barns.
- ❖ To allow for some flexibility, the Monday workday hours are between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. The fair is optimistic that with plenty of help and organization the job can be done by early afternoon.
- ❖ Volunteers will be checked in, organized into crews, assigned jobs, and checked out by a designated fair board member.
- ❖ An adult will supervise each youth work crew.
- ❖ The fair board will provide lunch for all volunteers working on Monday.
- ❖ Where transportation to the fair grounds and back home is an issue, fair board members come from all parts of the county and may be able to help with rides if requested.
- ❖ An exhibitor whose club is responsible for foodstand clean-up and who is working in the foodstand on Monday will be exempt from this requirement.
- ❖ While this is a requirement for those who sell at the sale, other fair exhibitors, parents, and other adults are also invited and encouraged to volunteer help.
