Chemicals accepted

- √ Usable, unwanted, damaged (frozen or mis-mixed), registration suspended or canceled agricultural chemicals
- √ Registration canceled agricultural pesticides including: DDT, chlordane, lead arsenate, and lindane
- √ Waste antifreeze & contaminated motor oil
- √ Other chemicals including: unusable animal medications and vaccines, teat wash, solvents, degreasers, rodent baits
- √ Paint additives, lead-based paints, oil-based paints, paint remover, stains, etc.
- √ Household cleaners, solvents, car maintenance products, wall or driveway sealers
- √ Household hazardous waste

Unacceptable

- X Empty agricultural chemical containers
- X Infectious or biological wastes
- X Compressed gas cylinders
- X Explosives, radioactive waste
- X Freon
- X Tires
- X Batteries
- X Latex paint
- X Waste oil
- X Fluorescent bulbs

Who can participate?

All residents of Richland County can participate.

Steps to participate

1. Check your barns, sheds, basement, attic, or garage for hazardous chemicals.
2. Due to reductions in funding, we will be charging participants to drop off their waste. The cost will be:

\$10/car for Household Clean Sweep;

\$20/car for Agriculture Clean Sweep.

3. **PRE-REGISTRATION IS MANDATORY!**
Deadline is Thursday, October 1.
Phone in or drop off the attached form at the Richland County UW-Extension Office in Melvill Hall on the UW-Richland Campus. Phone: 647-6148.
4. At the time of pre-registration, a drop-off time will be scheduled and further information given regarding safe handling of hazardous materials.
5. Put items in a box lined with a garbage bag to eliminate spillage. Bring your waste chemicals to the Richland County Highway Shop at your appointed time. Payment is due at this time.

- ▶ Old, unusable latex paint is not a hazardous waste and can be evaporated and disposed of in the trash.
- ▶ Computers are being accepted at the Goodwill Store in Richland Center.
