SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship will be scored as follows:

Cleanliness of cat	20 points
Grooming of cat and exhibitor	20 points
Picking up, holding and showing of cat	10 points
Responding to questions	30 points
Test score	20 points

Grade Groups: 7 and Under 8 and Over

Categories: Creative Design Educational Illustration

Limit one poster per category.

Use standard size poster board (14" X 22"). Recommend 1 inch of unmarked border.

All posters must include on the back:

Name of Exhibitor
Address
County
Grade of Exhibitor as of Jan. 1st of the current year.

The topic can be anything related to the cat project such as care, training, health, nutrition, breed color, history of breeds, anatomy, etc.

No part of the poster may protrude 1/8 of an inch over the poster board. No sharp objects may be glued to the poster.

DRAWING AND PAINTING CONTEST

Grade Divisions: 7 and under 8 and over (as of Jan.1st of current year)

Only one entry per exhibitor permitted.

All exhibits are to be original work of the exhibitor and must relate to the Cat Project.

Each entry must have the following listed on the back:

- Name of exhibitor
- Address
- County
- Grade of exhibitor as of Jan.1 of the current year

Size: Minimum of 9” X12” (finished, matted size)
Maximum of 18”X24” (finished, matted size)

Medium: Pencil, chalk, charcoal, pen & ink or pastels
Painting – any media (watercolor, acrylic, oil)

Presentation: All paperwork must be matted with a suitable matting board, with a maximum 3” border. Recommended matting boards are: Crescent, Aphamat and Bainbridge brand name matting boards. No glass allowed. (Plexiglas or some other protective covering may be used.) All oil and acrylic must have a suitable frame (stretcher frames are acceptable). All entries must attach a 3”X5” card indicating information about the exhibit (choice of subject or color, medium used, etc.)

RULES

1. Cats may be purebred, with or without papers, or household pets.
2. All cats must be under the daily care, feeding, and supervision of the exhibitor as of March 1st of the current exhibit year.
3. Kittens must be at least 5 months old by May 1 of the current year.
4. Display cages will be provided for judging. All cats are to be removed and taken home immediately after judging is complete.
5. All cats must be brought to judging with nails clipped and in carriers.
6. Exhibitors may exhibit two animals but not in the same lot number.
7. All cats are required to be immunized for distemper, rhino and rabies. As proof, a certificate of immunization must be shown prior to judging. Inoculations must have been administered within the past year or as prescribed by your veterinarian and at least three weeks before May 1 of the current exhibit year. Please include a copy of your cat's shot record with your entry.
8. Cats will be judged on general appearance and condition, temperament, proper handling, hair, coat, paws, nails and body build.
9. Pregnant female or nursing female cats are not to be shown.
10. It is highly recommended, but not required, that all cats are spayed or neutered.

- Enter an open cat show other than 4-H
- Enter showmanship at Pre-Fair or State Show
- Youth Leadership on county level

4 POINTS

- Volunteer to help with anything except for set up, clean up, or swabbing at any cat show.
- Enter poster, photography, catology or drawing and painting contests.
- 4-H Communications Arts Festival Entry (Cat Related)
- Submit design for state show logo
- Pet Merit Badge- cat related
- Give cat speech/demo at club, county or school
- Take your cat to visit a nursing home/shut-ins

3 POINTS

- Cat Project Jr. Leader for current year (each activity)
- Attend county meetings
- Swab cages at any cat show
- Get non cat project member to participate in Pre-Fair or State Cat Show (Open to all 4-Hers including Cloverbuds)

2 POINTS

- Enter a decorate a cage contest
- Enter a dress a cat contest
- Place in poster, photography, catology or drawing and painting contest
- Each time you volunteer at the Humane Society
- Spectator only at a cat show or clinic
- Deliver donations to the Humane Society after collection dates

1 POINT

- For each donation (item) to Humane Society and Touched By A Paw

MISCELLANEOUS POINTS

- 10-20 points for a written article of fostering cats and/or kittens
- 5-10 points for a scrapbook of cat related information from current year
- 1-5 points for a written page telling what you learned this year
