Rain water running off of roofs contributes to flooding, streambank erosion and water pollution in our urban areas. Rain water can be a valuable resource around the home, since our flowering plants prefer this water to treated city water or the "hard" water from most wells. In this presentation we will explore why controlling runoff from our homes is important and the role that rain barrels and other simple techniques can play to reduce this impact. We'll also discuss common issues and concerns with rain barrels such as overflow and mosquitoes.
