Open to 4-H members enrolled in Music Project 371 or youth doing similar work in another youth organization.

Lot Number

001. Performance Solo – VHS, CD or cassette of performance to include and introduction, 3x5 card explaining the experience, copy of the music performed and photo of performer.
002. Performance Ensemble – VHS, CD or cassette of performance to include an introduction, 3x5 card explaining the experience, copy of the music performed and photo of performers. (Each 4-H band member shall submit separate exhibits.)
003. Composition – copy of original composition and photo of composer, VHS, CD or cassette of performance, 3x5 card explaining what was learned
004. Musical Genre – a study of any area of music – include an educational display, 1 page summary
005. Display on 6 types of instruments or 2 contrasting groups of instruments – include an education display, 1 page summary
006. Handmade instrument – include a 3x5 card explaining your instrument
007. Music project outreach – exhibit showing participation in teaching, sharing, or performing. Can also be an interview with a professional musician, etc. – include an educational display, 1 page summary
