Impacting Washington County by:

- **Improving Quality of Life for Washington County Residents**

Every year UW-Extension conducts over 452 educational programs, making over 22,850 educational contacts to residents of Washington County. UWEX reaches thousands of additional residents through newsletters and email.

- **Educating and Empowering Citizen Volunteers**

UW-Extension partners with 972 youth and adult volunteers who donate approximately 14,580 hours to Washington County in 2007. This dollar value would be \$204,120 at \$14.00 per hour.

- **Addressing Community Issues through Research & Education**

UW-Extension worked with 177 partners to address community needs that have resulted in community strategic planning, increasing resources for non-profits, develop peer mentoring in schools, extending nutrition education for under-served families and building family and community strengths. (partners may overlap between program areas)

- **Adding Value to the Local Economy**

The UW-Extension Educators in the Washington County office are supported by 284 campus faculty and 437 county-based faculty in all of Wisconsin's 72 counties. This statewide network of support brings additional knowledge and expertise to Washington County through the UW-Extension office.
