4-H FLL teams will participate as teams. Exhibitors that are not part of a 4-H FLL team may participate in entries either individually or with other 4-H members. Exhibitors can only present their individual work. In

the case where the work cannot be shown individually, exhibitors must provide details to the judges clearly describing their own work. Judging will be face-to-face. Participants may enter no more than four entries and only one entry per entry type (project, design, programming, or robot performance). You may not sign up for both team and individual entry for a given entry type, e.g., Project presentation.

SPECIAL EMPHASIS – My World


The January/February “My World” focus is Geographical. Here are some topic ideas for clubs to explore:


 Learn about the natural resources found in your region, and how those resources led to the industrialization of the region. How was the history, economics, etc. influenced? Example: Lumber and iron industries in the Midwest


 Choose to find out more about the common foods in your region. Use this information to trace the origins of these foods. Learn more about the culture and beliefs related to the foods. Example: Bratwurst,


beer, cheese, kringle, fry bread, fondue, cream puffs, cranberries, Friday night fish fry in Wisconsin


 Learn about the history of the Hmong people. Where are their origins? Why and when have many immigrated to the U.S.? Where do large numbers of Hmong immigrants live? What effect has this population had in your region?


 Learn more about the arts associated with your region. How have the arts affected your region’s culture and history? Have any particular arts spread to other areas or had a significant effect on society? Example: German-American music, African music, Chicano arts

 Research the Tibet region of China. Learn more about the region’s people, politics, natural geography, religion and other cultural aspects. How do these influences affect the current conflict with the Chinese government in the Tibetan region?

 Learn more about migration and population trends. Trace the origins of specific ethnic groups in a region. How and why did these groups relocate? How do these groups influence life in the region? Example: Mexicans in U.S. (or a specific region of U.S.), Cajuns in Louisiana, Cubans in Florida

The Waukesha County 4-H Endowment Fund is organized and operated for the exclusive purpose of providing long-term financial support for 4-H activities in Waukesha County. Your contribution will not only be used to enrich and expand current 4-H activities but also develop new 4-H programs within Waukesha County.

The Endowment Fund supports: Educational resources and program materials; Youth and Leader training; Youth scholarships to leadership development programs such as State 4-H Youth Conference, Citizenship Washington Focus, National 4-H Congress and National 4-H Conference; Awards and college scholarships to recognize 4-H achievement; summer camp.

How the Fund Works. The Waukesha County 4-H Endowment Fund can accept gifts and donations to the Waukesha County 4-H program. The goal of this fund is to distribute earnings to the Waukesha County 4-H Leader's Association. The Trust Board is authorized on an annual basis to distribute up to 75% of the income of the Trust for the calendar year. The Trust Board is instructed to retain all capital gains recognized until such time as the trust reaches \$50,000. We are currently around \$35,000.

Who can contribute? Anyone can contribute. Gifts of any size are welcome and appreciated. As a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization, your gift to the Waukesha County 4-H Endowment Fund is fully tax deductible. Cash gifts as well as gifts of stock, real estate and land are acceptable.
