At this time, there are NO RENTALS AVAILABLE. There is also the possibility of doing .177 air pistol at the same time depending on the numbers.

Shooting Sports Leaders

Reminder, all leaders and members MUST sign up for the shooting sports discipline they wish to participate in EACH YEAR! Also, members MUST BE AT LEAST 12 YEARS OLD to participate in doing any actual shooting of any POWDER BURNING FIREARMS, i.e. .22 Rifle, Shotgun, or Muzzleloading. These are both state 4-H and national 4-H guidelines.
