

## COUNTY PROJECT MEDAL MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

1. Member must have given a planned and prepared demonstration or speech, individually or as part of a two-member team, at any Waukesha County event\* in the project for which the member is seeking the medal. It is highly recommended that the demonstration and speech be carried through to the County Demonstration and Speech Contest Day for individual development and recommendation for higher awards.

\*County Events: County Demonstration Day Contest where the demonstration or speech is judged. County Fair Youth-in-Action Stage, County Project Fest/Open House, any 4-H County level or open to the public community event or workshop for a general audience where the presentation is a special part of the workshop and arrangements are made for someone to critique the demonstration. (A project meeting held in a county building does not count.)

Make arrangements for someone to critique and sign the Demonstration/Speech Check Form, if doing a demonstration or speech other than at County Demonstration Day Contest. The Check Form is required to be included in the Record Book with the Project Record Sheet.

2. Must have at least one individual exhibit at County Fair in the project each year, not just a club project group exhibit, unless animal died, or something similar.
3. Must have carried project at least two (2) years before eligible for a medal, need not be consecutive years.
4. Must be enrolled in project this year to receive medal.
5. Check that the size of the project over the years shows growth as a member becomes older. (Look for evidence that the member has really learned from his or her experiences, new skills have been developed and progress is shown from the previous year. Leadership is evident, member shares knowledge with others and works closely with his/her club.)
6. Must have project record sheets for all years. Must have financial records, if required in the project. The following projects require financial records:

7. In checking for project medal -- All years in project are counted.
8. A medal may be received only once in each project.
9. Member must have completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade to be eligible for this medal.
10. Member must submit a completed record book to their club and the leader(s) sends it on to the County for project medal consideration adhering to the published deadline dates.

## COUNTY HONORS -- PROJECT MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

**Exhibit 5B**

1. Must have received County Project Medal first. Does not necessarily follow that you get honors after medal is received.
2. Honors are given only on this year's work -- not on all years combined. Must have done outstanding work this year.
3. Must have at least one individual exhibit at County Fair in the project this year, not just a club project group exhibit, unless dog dies, or something similar.
4. Must be enrolled in the project this year to receive honors.
5. Must have given at least one demonstration or speech in that project at the general club meeting, or above, this year. In order to qualify as a demonstration, it must be a planned and prepared presentation with posters, having an introduction, body and closing with a summary.
  - As per the Executive Board, must have given a County Demonstration (not just a speech) at some time during all past year in the project to be considered for honors.
6. Must have project record sheet for the past year and financial record, if required, in this project for current year. Projects requiring financial records are:

beef	dairy	pets
beekeeping	dairy goat	poultry
caged birds	dog	rabbits
cavies	horse and pony	sheep
cat	llama	swine
7. Must show growth in project from the year project medal was awarded. (Look for evidence that the member has really learned from his or her experiences, that new skills have been developed and progress shown from previous year. Leadership is evident, shares knowledge with others and works closely with his or her local club.)
8. Honors may be received every year in a project if a member's work merits it.
9. Member must submit a completed record book to their club and the leader(s) sends it on to the County for Project Honors consideration adhering to the published deadlines.
