

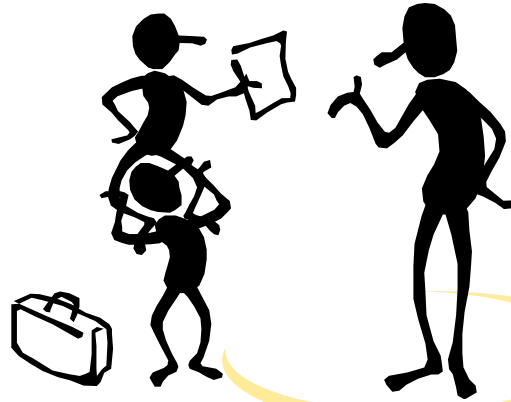
Manawa C.A.R.E.S. Mission Statement

Our History

The information from Search Institute on youth asset building began in Manawa with the Title V Juvenile Delinquency Prevention county wide assessment in 2000, Again in 2006 the youth profiles from Search Institute were conducted and the results were then shared by school district leaders with parents and community partners. At these public meetings enthused citizens organized into what is now known as Manawa C.A.R.E.S. This Manawa group learned about the positive youth development framework of 40 Developmental Assets. They developed a vision and mission, started efforts toward non-profit status, brainstormed ideas and action steps on how to build assets with our youth.
