# School to Manufacturing Opportunity

## Why would a Student be interested?

- Work experiences (summer) that allow youth exposure to different job skills and careers.
- Support for post-secondary education at Technical College or University System related to job placement.



## Why would a Manufacturer be interested?

- Connection to school students and preparing future employees with job skills.

## How Does It Work?

- Applications for high school 10th or 11th graders can be found in the guidance office .
- Transcribed college coursework connects school academics to work experiences in graphic design, drafting, engineering, robotics, metal fabrication, welding, machining and much more.
- Hands on summer work experience in local manufacturing company prepares students for careers and continuing their education beyond high school.

## Everyone has a role in the School to Manufacturing partnership:

- Employers will provide meaningful work and encourage students to pursue manufacturing careers.
- Student employees will be expected to follow the same rules as all other company employees at their business.
- Parents will support their child's participation and ensure transportation is provided.
- Schools will partner with manufacturing to tailor a course path that will support the opportunity in manufacturing.
