**Housing** -- All overnight campers should report to and will be housed in Cole residence hall, which is located just off the shoreline of Lake Mendota on the beautiful University of Wisconsin campus. The residence hall is within walking distance of all Badger Dairy Camp activities. Badger Dairy Club camp counselors will supervise Camp residence halls. Meals will be served at nearby Frank’s Place, a campus dining facility.

**Medical** -- Badger Dairy campers will have access to the University Health Services. Therefore, individual insurance coverage and emergency medical authorization is needed.

**Rules** -- Individuals are required to comply with the rules and regulations of the University of Wisconsin and University Housing. Any camper who does not abide by these rules may be dismissed with no refund.

**What to Bring** -- Campers need to bring, in addition to normal clothing items: clipping clothing, work shoes, clipping and fitting supplies if available, white show pants, clipboard, towels, toiletries and clothing for sports activities (i.e. volleyball, tennis & basketball). Each dorm room contains a small refrigerator so campers are welcome to bring their own drinks and snacks.
