

**“Comment Page” for:
Summary Statistics of WI Household Hazardous Waste
Permanent Collection Programs**

- I. **Averages by Year per Program (all populations):**
 - a. *Year*
 - b. *Programs held*
 - i. Number of communities holding programs during a specific year.
 - c. *Total Visits Avg.*
 - i. Average visits during a given year. This number is derived from the “Total Annual Visits” data found in our summary report “II. Lbs. Collected Per Year”
 - d. *Percentage Total Visits*
 - i. “Total Annual Visits” divided by the “Total population” of communities holding a collection program.
 - ii. **Note:** This is a percentage of the total population reported for those communities. A 100% household participation rate in the Clean Sweep programs will probably read as 20%-30%, since each household usually has several members.
 - e. *Avg. Total Lbs Collected*
 - i. Average of “Total Pounds Collected” in the communities during a given year. This number is derived from “Total Waste Collected in Lbs.” found in our summary report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community”
 - f. *Avg. Cost Contractor Services*
 - i. Average of cost of contractor services only, not total cost of the program. This number is derived from “Cost of Contractor Services” found in our report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community.”
 - g. *Avg. Waste Cost/lb*
 - i. Average cost per billed pound. This number is derived from “Waste Cost/Lb” (Cost of Contractor Services divided by Total Waste Collected” found in our report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community.”
 - ii. This is based on “Cost of Contractor Services,” not the total of the Clean Sweep.
 - h. *Avg. Lbs/ Visit*
 - i. Average pounds collected per visit. This number is derived from “Lbs/Visit” found in our report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community.”

II. Lbs. Collected Per Year

- a. *Year*
- b. *Total Annual Visits.*
 - i. These are the total visits that a community receives in a given year. This number is derived from “Total Annual Visits” found in our report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community.”
- c. *Total lbs. Collected p/Year*
 - i. Shows total lbs. collected through Permanent collection clean sweeps around Wisconsin during a given year.
- d. *Cumulative Lbs. Collected*
 - i. Shows total lbs. collected in clean sweeps from the beginning of our records in 1984 until the present.
- e. *Total Population*
 - i. This represents the population of all the communities that participated in that year’s clean sweeps around the state. This number is derived of “Potential Households in Region” found in our report “III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community.”
 - ii. The “Potential Household in Region reflects the total population of the county according to the census divided by 2.5.

III. Permanent Collections Summary by Community

- a. *County or City*
 - i. Name of the community/county/city/village that held a Clean Sweep program.
- b. *Date*
 - i. Year of the Clean Sweep.
- c. *Contractor*
 - i. Name of the contractor. For instance: Onyx, Laidlaw, Clean Harbors, WRR Environmental Services, etc.
- d. *Source of Funds (1)*
 - i. This indicates where the funds to support the program are coming from:
 - 1. l= local: County or municipal funds, landfill tipping fees
 - 2. s= state: DNR grants
 - 3. f= federal: EPA end-of-year funds
 - 4. p= private: donations from local businesses or community groups
- e. *Total Annual Visits*
 - i. Number of households/customers that participated in a Clean Sweeps for a specific community.
- f. *Potential H-Holds in Region*
 - i. This reflects the potential households in the area holding the Clean Sweep.
 - ii. We verify numbers in the forms by checking the census data. The method used to obtain in the figure is:
 - 1. Take the county population estimate for that year;
 - 2. Divide this number by 2.5.
- g. *% Partic. of H-Holds**

- i. This is a product of dividing “Total Annual Visits” by “Potential Households in Region” (total population of the area).
- h. *Total Waste Collect. Pounds*
 - i. If a county provides the amount of total pounds collected, this number is used.
 - ii. If counties provide an invoice and/or manifest, and:
 - 1. If there is a difference in quantity between the county's report, the manifest, and/or the invoice:
 - a. First priority: the quantities listed on invoice under "units for disposal."
 - b. Second priority: itemized pounds and gallons on manifest, their totals.
 - 2. If there is no difference in quantities listed on invoice, manifest and the county's summary sheet, we use total pounds from the summary sheet.
- i. *Cost of Contractor Services (Dollars)*
 - i. This is the cost for contractor services only, not the total cost of the Clean Sweep.
- j. *Waste Cost/Lb (2)*
 - i. This number is a product of dividing “Cost of Contractor Services” by the “Total Waste Collect. Pounds.”
- k. *Prog. Cost/Year*
 - i. This includes all program costs such as: contractor services, maintenance, publicity, rent, waste disposal, salaries, educ. materials, insurance, staff, etc.
- l. *VSQG / Ag (3)*
 - i. This column indicates if the cost of the program per year includes costs for collecting from VSQGs or from Agricultural CS.
- m. *Progr Cost/Lb (4)*
 - i. This is derived from the “Prog. Cost/year” divided by the “Total Waste Collect. Pounds.”
- n. *Lbs/Visit (5)*
 - i. This is derived from the “Total Waste Collect. Pounds” divided by the “Total Annual Visits.”
- o. *Disposal Type (6)*
 - 1. Hazardous Waste Incineration
 - 2. Secondary Fuel Incineration
 - 3. Hazardous Waste Landfill
 - 4. Treatment such as neutralization
 - 5. Recycling. Includes: Solvent recovery and Waste oil refining
 - 6. Storage
 - 7. Product exchange
 - 8. Treatment: Other
