V. Nelly Salgado de Snyder (Mexico) received her Ph.D. in Social Welfare from the University of California, Los Angeles in 1986. She is currently Director of the Health Systems Determinants Unit, Center for Health Systems Research at the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico (INSP). She is the coordinator of the research line of Health in Vulnerable Groups at the INSP. She has published over 90 journal articles, books and book chapters about social vulnerability and health, working with groups such as Mexican immigrants in the U.S., rural inhabitants, and elderly men and women living in poverty. Dr. Salgado de Snyder has conducted numerous research projects, and participated as international consultant for government and non-governmental institutions as well as national and international organizations. She has been recognized for her contributions in Mexico and in the U.S., she holds the highest research level (Level 3) at the *Sistema Nacional de Investigadores de Mexico*. Additionally, Dr. Salgado de Snyder is a member of Mexican Academy of Scientific Research, a Fellow of the American Psychological Association, a Fulbright Fellow, and more recently designated New Century Scholar by the Fulbright Program on Health in a Borderless World.
