

Safe Ways to Deal with Plant Food on Your Farm



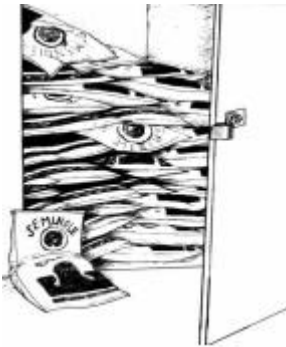
You may use plant food on your plants to help them grow. This plant food is called **fertilizer**.

Watch out! Plant food can get into your well water. This water can make your family sick. You cannot drink the water until it is cleaned

Here are safe ways to deal with plant food.

1.

Keep plant food in the container you bought it in. Keep it dry and closed tight. Keep plant food off the ground and locked up. Keep the plant food away from your children. Do not keep the plant food near your well.



Keep plant food in a barn or shed with a hard floor.

2.

Do not spill any plant food on the ground. This plant food can get into your well water. Then you cannot drink the well water until it is cleaned. This can cost a lot of money.

3.

Make sure the machine you use puts the right amount of plant food on your plants. You can get help with this. Ask at the store where bought the plant food.

After you put out the plant food, wash your machine with water. Save this water to put on the same plants.
